ethics	The philosophical study of moral values and rules. Medical ethics also enter into the question.
excellence	The quality of being outstanding or extremely good. A centre of academic excellence .
excellent	Extremely good; outstanding. Made an excellent speech.
exceptional	Unusually good; outstanding. Special educational provisions for exceptional children.
<u>exemplar</u>	Something to be imitated. The place is an exemplar of multicultural Britain.

lubuloub	The fabulous endurance of a marathon runner.
fine	Characterized by elegance or refinement or accomplishment. The fine hand of a master.
goodness	The quality of being morally good or virtuous. A belief in the basic goodness of mankind.
ideally	In the best possible way; perfectly. <i>Her experience makes her ideally suited to the job.</i>
merit	The quality of being deserving (e.g., deserving assistance. The results have been encouraging enough to merit further investigation.
moral	Concerned with the principles of right and wrong behaviour. <i>He is a caring moral man.</i>
morality	A particular system of values and principles of conduct. The issue of the morality of the possession of nuclear weapons.
nice	Socially or conventionally correct; refined or virtuous. A nice face.
passable	Just good enough to be acceptable; satisfactory. <i>He spoke passable English.</i>
<u>perfection</u>	The state of being without a flaw or defect. Among the key tasks was the perfection of new mechanisms of economic management.
pleasing	Pleasant or agreeable to the senses. A pleasing piece of news.
satisfactorily	In a way that fulfils expectations or needs; acceptably. The matter is considered to be satisfactorily resolved.
<u>satisfactory</u>	(of evidence or a verdict) sufficient for the needs of the case. <i>The step makes a satisfactory seat.</i>
<u>situated</u>	Situated in a particular spot or position. Nicely situated on a quiet riverbank.
<u>superiority</u>	The state of being superior. <i>He attacked the media s smug superiority.</i>
virtue	A good or useful quality of a thing. <i>Paragons of virtue</i> .
well	In a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. Being short of breath may well be the first sign of asthma.
