ethics	The philosophical study of moral values and rules. <i>Medical ethics also enter into the question.</i>
excellence	The quality of being outstanding or extremely good. <i>A centre of academic excellence.</i>
excellent	Extremely good; outstanding. <i>Made an excellent speech.</i>
exceptional	Unusually good; outstanding. <i>Special educational provisions for exceptional children.</i>
exemplar	Something to be imitated. <i>The place is an exemplar of multicultural Britain.</i>

fabulous	Barely credible. <i>The fabulous endurance of a marathon runner.</i>
fine	Characterized by elegance or refinement or accomplishment. <i>The fine hand of a master.</i>
goodness	The quality of being morally good or virtuous. <i>A belief in the basic goodness of mankind.</i>
<u>ideally</u>	In the best possible way; perfectly. <i>Her experience makes her ideally suited to the job.</i>
merit	The quality of being deserving (e.g., deserving assistance). <i>The results have been encouraging enough to merit further investigation.</i>
moral	Concerned with the principles of right and wrong behaviour. <i>He is a caring moral man.</i>
morality	A particular system of values and principles of conduct. <i>The issue of the morality of the possession of nuclear weapons.</i>
nice	Socially or conventionally correct; refined or virtuous. <i>A nice face.</i>
passable	Just good enough to be acceptable; satisfactory. <i>He spoke passable English.</i>
<u>perfection</u>	The state of being without a flaw or defect. <i>Among the key tasks was the perfection of new mechanisms of economic management.</i>
pleasing	Pleasant or agreeable to the senses. <i>A pleasing piece of news.</i>
satisfactorily	In a way that fulfils expectations or needs; acceptably. <i>The matter is considered to be satisfactorily resolved.</i>
<u>satisfactory</u>	(of evidence or a verdict) sufficient for the needs of the case. <i>The step makes a satisfactory seat.</i>
<u>situated</u>	Situated in a particular spot or position. <i>Nicely situated on a quiet riverbank.</i>
<u>superiority</u>	The state of being superior. <i>He attacked the media's smug superiority.</i>
virtue	A good or useful quality of a thing. <i>Paragons of virtue.</i>
well	In a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>Being short of breath may well be the first sign of asthma.</i>
