<b>best</b>	Written at the end of a letter to wish a person well. <i>She dressed in her <b>best</b>.</i>
<b>bioethics</b>	The ethics of medical and biological research.
<a href="#">chivalry</a>	Knights, noblemen, and horsemen collectively. <i>The age of <b>chivalry</b>.</i>
<b>enjoy</b>	Derive or receive pleasure from get enjoyment from take pleasure in. <i><b>Enjoy</b> privileges.</i>
<b>ethic</b>	The principles of right and wrong that are accepted by an individual or a social group. <i>The <b>ethic</b> question is of wider import.</i>
<b>ethics</b>	The philosophical study of moral values and rules. <i>Medical <b>ethics</b> also enter into the question.</i>
<b>excellence</b>	The quality of being outstanding or extremely good. <i>A centre of academic <b>excellence</b>.</i>
<b>excellent</b>	Extremely good; outstanding. <i>Made an <b>excellent</b> speech.</i>
<b>exceptional</b>	Unusually good; outstanding. <i>Special educational provisions for <b>exceptional</b> children.</i>
<a href="#">exemplar</a>	Something to be imitated. <i>The place is an <b>exemplar</b> of multicultural Britain.</i>

<b>fabulous</b>	Barely credible. <i>The <b>fabulous</b> endurance of a marathon runner.</i>
<b>fine</b>	Characterized by elegance or refinement or accomplishment. <i>The <b>fine</b> hand of a master.</i>
<b>goodness</b>	The quality of being morally good or virtuous. <i>A belief in the basic <b>goodness</b> of mankind.</i>
<b><u>ideally</u></b>	In the best possible way; perfectly. <i>Her experience makes her <b>ideally</b> suited to the job.</i>
<b>merit</b>	The quality of being deserving (e.g., deserving assistance). <i>The results have been encouraging enough to <b>merit</b> further investigation.</i>
<b>moral</b>	Concerned with the principles of right and wrong behaviour. <i>He is a caring <b>moral</b> man.</i>
<b>morality</b>	A particular system of values and principles of conduct. <i>The issue of the <b>morality</b> of the possession of nuclear weapons.</i>
<b>nice</b>	Socially or conventionally correct; refined or virtuous. <i>A <b>nice</b> face.</i>
<b>passable</b>	Just good enough to be acceptable; satisfactory. <i>He spoke <b>passable</b> English.</i>
<b><u>perfection</u></b>	The state of being without a flaw or defect. <i>Among the key tasks was the <b>perfection</b> of new mechanisms of economic management.</i>
<b>pleasing</b>	Pleasant or agreeable to the senses. <i>A <b>pleasing</b> piece of news.</i>
<b>satisfactorily</b>	In a way that fulfils expectations or needs; acceptably. <i>The matter is considered to be <b>satisfactorily</b> resolved.</i>
<b><u>satisfactory</u></b>	(of evidence or a verdict) sufficient for the needs of the case. <i>The step makes a <b>satisfactory</b> seat.</i>
<b><u>situated</u></b>	Situated in a particular spot or position. <i>Nicely <b>situated</b> on a quiet riverbank.</i>
<b><u>superiority</u></b>	The state of being superior. <i>He attacked the media's smug <b>superiority</b>.</i>
<b>virtue</b>	A good or useful quality of a thing. <i>Paragons of <b>virtue</b>.</i>
<b>well</b>	In a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>Being short of breath may <b>well</b> be the first sign of asthma.</i>
