| glint | A momentary flash of light. <i>Her glasses glinted in the firelight.</i> |
| glisten | The quality of shining with a bright reflected light. <i>There was a glisten of perspiration across her top lip.</i> |
| <u>glitter</u> | An attractive and exciting but superficial quality. <i>Sneakers trimmed with sequins and glitter.</i> |

| glow | Light from nonthermal sources. <i>The coals were glowing in the dark.</i> |
| illuminate | Decorate (a building or structure) with lights for a special occasion. <i>Placing the events of the 1930s in a broader historical context helps to illuminate their significance.</i> |
| illumination | A condition of spiritual awareness divine illumination. <i>Higher levels of illumination are needed for reading.</i> |
| illumine | Light up; brighten. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was illuminated.</i> |
| infrared | Of equipment or techniques using or concerned with infrared radiation. <i>Infrared photography.</i> |
| phosphorescent | Emitting light without appreciable heat as by slow oxidation of phosphorous. <i>The phosphorescent glow of decaying wood.</i> |
| radiance | An attractive combination of good health and happiness. <i>Restore your skin s natural radiance.</i> |
| radiant | A radiant point. <i>Don t assume that you should stare toward the radiant to see the most meteors.</i> |
| radiation | The energy transmitted by radiation. <i>Evolution is a process of radiation not progression.</i> |
| ray | Emit as rays. <i>Take a specific point and back trace every ray of light that hits that point.</i> |
| shine | Make a surface shine. <i>Tonight he will have a chance to shine and win a world boxing title.</i> |
| sparkle | Become bubbly or frothy or foaming. <i>She s got a kind of sparkle.</i> |
| spectroscopy | The branch of science concerned with the investigation and measurement of spectra produced when matter interacts with or emits electromagnetic radiation. |
| sunlight | Light from the sun. <i>A shaft of sunlight.</i> |
| sunshine | Cheerfulness; happiness. <i>We walked in the warm sunshine.</i> |
| twinkle | Emit or reflect light in a flickering manner. <i>His sandalled feet twinkled over the ground.</i> |
