<b>auroral</b>	Characteristic of the dawn. <i>A dim <b>auroral</b> glow.</i>

<b><u>beam</u></b>	An oscillating shaft which transmits the vertical piston movement of a beam engine to the crank or pump. <i>A <b>beam</b> of satisfaction.</i>

<b>brilliance</b>	Vividness of colour. <i>Lapis lazuli was highly regarded for the <b>brilliance</b> of its colour.</i>
<b>emitter</b>	The electrode in a transistor where electrons originate. <i>Infrared <b>emitters</b>.</i>
<b>flash</b>	A newsflash. <i>A <b>flash</b> car.</i>
<b><u>gleam</u></b>	An expression of an emotion or quality in a person's eyes. <i>A terrible thought <b>gleamed</b> in her mind.</i>
<b>glimmer</b>	A faint or wavering light. <i>The moonlight <b>glimmered</b> on the lawn.</i>
<b>glint</b>	A momentary flash of light. <i>Her glasses <b>glinted</b> in the firelight.</i>
<b>glisten</b>	The quality of shining with a bright reflected light. <i>There was a <b>glisten</b> of perspiration across her top lip.</i>
<b><u>glitter</u></b>	An attractive and exciting but superficial quality. <i>Sneakers trimmed with sequins and <b>glitter</b>.</i>

<b>glow</b>	Light from nonthermal sources. <i>The coals were <b>glowing</b> in the dark.</i>
<b>illuminate</b>	Decorate (a building or structure) with lights for a special occasion. <i>Placing the events of the 1930s in a broader historical context helps to <b>illuminate</b> their significance.</i>
<b>illumination</b>	A condition of spiritual awareness divine illumination. <i>Higher levels of <b>illumination</b> are needed for reading.</i>
<b>illumine</b>	Light up; brighten. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was <b>illuminated</b>.</i>
<b>infrared</b>	Of equipment or techniques using or concerned with infrared radiation. <i><b>Infrared</b> photography.</i>
<b>phosphorescent</b>	Emitting light without appreciable heat as by slow oxidation of phosphorous. <i>The <b>phosphorescent</b> glow of decaying wood.</i>
<b>radiance</b>	An attractive combination of good health and happiness. <i>Restore your skin s natural <b>radiance</b>.</i>
<b>radiant</b>	A radiant point. <i>Don t assume that you should stare toward the <b>radiant</b> to see the most meteors.</i>
<b>radiation</b>	The energy transmitted by radiation. <i>Evolution is a process of <b>radiation</b> not progression.</i>
<b>ray</b>	Emit as rays. <i>Take a specific point and back trace every <b>ray</b> of light that hits that point.</i>
<b>shine</b>	Make a surface shine. <i>Tonight he will have a chance to <b>shine</b> and win a world boxing title.</i>
<b><u>sparkle</u></b>	Become bubbly or frothy or foaming. <i>She s got a kind of <b>sparkle</b>.</i>
<b>spectroscopy</b>	The branch of science concerned with the investigation and measurement of spectra produced when matter interacts with or emits electromagnetic radiation.
<b>sunlight</b>	Light from the sun. <i>A shaft of <b>sunlight</b>.</i>
<b>sunshine</b>	Cheerfulness; happiness. <i>We walked in the warm <b>sunshine</b>.</i>
<b><u>twinkle</u></b>	Emit or reflect light in a flickering manner. <i>His sandalled feet <b>twinkled</b> over the ground.</i>
