Associations of "In line with" (30 Words)

bend	Bend one s back forward from the waist on down. <i>Make a bend in the wire.</i>
bind	Provide with a binding. <i>Clay is made up chiefly of tiny soil particles that bind together tightly.</i>
entree	Something that provides access (to get in or get out). <i>She made a graceful entree into the ballroom.</i>
entry	The number of competitors in a particular race or competition. <i>The door was locked but he forced an entry.</i>
hank	A coil or skein of wool, hair, or other material. <i>A thick hank of her blonde hair.</i>
hawser	Large heavy rope for nautical use.
hem	Fold over and sew together to provide with a hem. <i>The hem of her dress was stained.</i>
intertwine	Connect or link (two or more things) closely. <i>As with most traditions fact and fiction have become inextricably intertwined.</i>
knot	Make a carpet or other decorative item with knots. <i>Tie a knot at the end of the cord.</i>
lace	Fasten or tighten a shoe or garment by tying the laces. <i>The shoes laced at the front.</i>
ligature	Bind or connect with a ligature. <i>There was no sign of the ligature which strangled her.</i>
orthogonal	Of or involving right angles; at right angles. <i>Wind and sea may displace the ship s center of gravity along three orthogonal axes.</i>

ply	Usually in combinations one of several layers of cloth or paper or wood as in plywood. <i>The yarn can be any ply from two to eight.</i>
pucker	Draw together into folds or puckers. <i>She puckered her lips.</i>
range	Have a range be capable of projecting over a certain distance as of a gun. <i>A duck came within range.</i>
rectangular	Placed or having parts placed at right angles. <i>A rectangular prism.</i>
rope	Of a party of climbers connect each other together with a rope. <i>I want you to show her the ropes.</i>
seam	Put together with a seam. <i>Sunderland have a rich seam of experienced players.</i>
skirt	A small flap on a saddle, covering the bar from which the stirrup leather hangs. <i>Bits of beef skirt.</i>
splice	Join by interweaving strands. <i>The break was due to an imperfect splice.</i>
<u>stitch</u>	Make mend or join something with stitches. <i>Hand stitched dresses.</i>
<u>strand</u>	Leave stranded or isolated with little hope of rescue. <i>Quantities of sea creatures were left stranded.</i>
<u>string</u>	The stringed instruments in an orchestra. <i>She wore a string of agates round her throat.</i>
<u>thread</u>	Pluck hairs from the eyebrows or another part of the body using a twisted cotton thread. <i>The thread that bound them had snapped.</i>
<u>tied</u>	Bound or secured closely. <i>A neatly tied package.</i>
tuck	Make a tuck or several folds in. <i>The colonel was coming toward her his gun tucked under his arm.</i>
twine	A lightweight cord. <i>She twined her arms round his neck.</i>
<u>tying</u>	The act of tying or binding things together.
wizened	Lean and wrinkled by shrinkage as from age or illness. <i>A wizened little man with frizzy grey hair.</i>
