Tie a **knot** at the end of the cord.

Fasten or tighten a shoe or garment by tying the laces.

The shoes **lace**d at the front.

ligature

Bind or connect with a ligature.

There was no sign of the **ligature** which strangled her.

Of or involving right angles; at right angles.

**orthogonal** Wind and sea may displace the ship's center of gravity along three

orthogonal axes.



Usually in combinations one of several layers of cloth or paper or wood as in

**ply** plywood.

The yarn can be any **ply** from two to eight.

**pucker** Draw together into folds or puckers.

She **pucker**ed her lips.

range Have a range be capable of projecting over a certain distance as of a gun.

A duck came within **range**.

Placed or having parts placed at right angles.

rectangular A rectangular prism.

Of a party of climbers connect each other together with a rope.

**seam** Put together with a seam.

Sunderland have a rich **seam** of experienced players.

A small flap on a saddle, covering the bar from which the stirrup leather

**skirt** hangs.

Bits of beef **skirt**.

splice Join by interweaving strands.

The break was due to an imperfect **splice**.

**stitch** Make mend or join something with stitches.

Hand **stitch**ed dresses.

Leave stranded or isolated with little hope of rescue.

Quantities of sea creatures were left **strand**ed.

The stringed instruments in an orchestra.

She wore a **string** of agates round her throat.

Pluck hairs from the eyebrows or another part of the body using a twisted

**thread** cotton thread.

The **thread** that bound them had snapped.

Bound or secured closely.

A neatly **tied** package.

tuck Make a tuck or several folds in.

The colonel was coming toward her his gun **tuck**ed under his arm.

twine A lightweight cord.

She **twine**d her arms round his neck.

**tying** The act of tying or binding things together.

**wizened** Lean and wrinkled by shrinkage as from age or illness.

A wizened little man with frizzy grey hair.

Tell or spin a yarn.

He never let reality get in the way of a good yarn.
