<u>covet</u>	Wish, long, or crave for (something, especially the property of another person. She <b>covet</b> s her sister s house.
<u>crave</u>	Ask for. If only she had shown her daughter the love she <b>crave</b> d.
<u>dearth</u>	An insufficient quantity or number. There is a <b>dearth</b> of evidence.
demand	The act of demanding. The boss <b>demand</b> ed that he be fired immediately.
essential	(of a disease) with no known external stimulus or cause; idiopathic. The <b>essential</b> weakness of the plaintiff s case.
<u>famine</u>	Hunger. The cotton <b>famine</b> of the 1860s.
<u>hunger</u>	Feel or suffer hunger. When he had fasted forty days and forty nights he afterwards <b>hunger</b> ed.
<u>inadequacy</u>	Inability to deal with a situation or with life. Juvenile offenses often reflect an <b>inadequacy</b> in the parents.
indispensability	The quality possessed by something that you cannot possibly do without.
<u>indispensable</u>	Absolutely necessary. An <b>indispensable</b> worker.
insufficiency	Inability of a bodily part or organ to function normally. <i>Renal insufficiency</i> .
<u>integral</u>	The result of a mathematical integration $F x$ is the integral of $f x$ if $dF dx f x$ . The first <b>integral</b> recording of the ten Mahler symphonies.
lack	Be without or deficient in. There is a <b>lack</b> of parking space in the town.



necessary	Unavoidably determined by prior circumstances. They granted the <b>necessary</b> planning permission.
<u>necessitate</u>	Make (something) necessary as a result or consequence. The late arrival had <b>necessitate</b> d her getting out of bed.
necessity	The condition of being essential or indispensable. A good book is a <b>necessity</b> when travelling.
needs	Of necessity. We must <b>needs</b> by objective.
obligate	Commit (assets) as security. An <b>obligate</b> anaerobe can survive only in the absence of oxygen.
oblige	Make (someone) legally or morally bound to do something. Tell me what you want to know and I ll see if I can <b>oblige</b> .
perforce	By necessity; by force of circumstance. Amateurs <b>perforce</b> have to settle for less expensive solutions.
<u>prerequisite</u>	Required as a prior condition or course of study. Latin was a <b>prerequisite</b> for admission.
request	The verbal act of requesting. To have our ideas taken seriously is surely a reasonable <b>request</b> .
require	Require as useful just or proper. Please indicate how many tickets you <b>require</b> .
required	Required by rule. <i>Required</i> reading.
requisite	A thing that is necessary for the achievement of a specified end. The application will not be processed until the <b>requisite</b> fee is paid.
scarcity	The state of being scarce or in short supply; shortage. A time of <b>scarcity</b> .
<u>shortage</u>	A state or situation in which something needed cannot be obtained in sufficient amounts. <i>Food shortages.</i>
shortfall	A deficit of something required or expected. They are facing an expected 10 billion <b>shortfall</b> in revenue.
<u>vital</u>	The body's important internal organs. Blood and other <b>vital</b> fluids.
want	Feel or have a desire for want strongly. Your former neighbor is <b>want</b> ed by the FBI.
