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| covet | Wish, long, or crave for (something, especially the property of another person. <i>She covets her sister s house.</i> |
| crave | Ask for. <i>If only she had shown her daughter the love she craved.</i> |
| dearth | An insufficient quantity or number. <i>There is a dearth of evidence.</i> |
| demand | The act of demanding. <i>The boss demanded that he be fired immediately.</i> |
| essential | (of a disease) with no known external stimulus or cause; idiopathic. <i>The essential weakness of the plaintiff s case.</i> |
| famine | Hunger. <i>The cotton famine of the 1860s.</i> |
| hunger | Feel or suffer hunger. <i>When he had fasted forty days and forty nights he afterwards hungered.</i> |
| inadequacy | Inability to deal with a situation or with life. <i>Juvenile offenses often reflect an inadequacy in the parents.</i> |
| indispensability | The quality possessed by something that you cannot possibly do without. |
| indispensable | Absolutely necessary. <i>An indispensable worker.</i> |
| insufficiency | Inability of a bodily part or organ to function normally. <i>Renal insufficiency.</i> |
| integral | The result of a mathematical integration $F x$ is the integral of $f x$ if $dF dx = f x$. <i>The first integral recording of the ten Mahler symphonies.</i> |
| lack | Be without or deficient in. <i>There is a lack of parking space in the town.</i> |

| necessary | Unavoidably determined by prior circumstances. <i>They granted the necessary planning permission.</i> |
| <u>necessitate</u> | Make (something) necessary as a result or consequence. <i>The late arrival had necessitated her getting out of bed.</i> |
| necessity | The condition of being essential or indispensable. <i>A good book is a necessity when travelling.</i> |
| needs | Of necessity. <i>We must needs by objective.</i> |
| obligate | Commit (assets) as security. <i>An obligate anaerobe can survive only in the absence of oxygen.</i> |
| oblige | Make (someone) legally or morally bound to do something. <i>Tell me what you want to know and I ll see if I can oblige.</i> |
| perforce | By necessity; by force of circumstance. <i>Amateurs perforce have to settle for less expensive solutions.</i> |
| <u>prerequisite</u> | Required as a prior condition or course of study. <i>Latin was a prerequisite for admission.</i> |
| request | The verbal act of requesting. <i>To have our ideas taken seriously is surely a reasonable request.</i> |
| require | Require as useful just or proper. <i>Please indicate how many tickets you require.</i> |
| required | Required by rule. <i>Required reading.</i> |
| requisite | A thing that is necessary for the achievement of a specified end. <i>The application will not be processed until the requisite fee is paid.</i> |
| scarcity | The state of being scarce or in short supply; shortage. <i>A time of scarcity.</i> |
| <u>shortage</u> | A state or situation in which something needed cannot be obtained in sufficient amounts. <i>Food shortages.</i> |
| shortfall | A deficit of something required or expected. <i>They are facing an expected 10 billion shortfall in revenue.</i> |
| <u>vital</u> | The body's important internal organs. <i>Blood and other vital fluids.</i> |
| want | Feel or have a desire for want strongly. <i>Your former neighbor is wanted by the FBI.</i> |
