## Associations of "In need" (30 Words)

<b>covet</b>	Wish, long, or crave for (something, especially the property of another person. <i>She <b>covets</b> her sister s house.</i>
<b>crave</b>	Ask for. <i>If only she had shown her daughter the love she <b>craved</b>.</i>
<b>dearth</b>	An insufficient quantity or number. <i>There is a <b>dearth</b> of evidence.</i>
<b>demand</b>	The act of demanding. <i>The boss <b>demanded</b> that he be fired immediately.</i>
<b>essential</b>	(of a disease) with no known external stimulus or cause; idiopathic. <i>The <b>essential</b> weakness of the plaintiff s case.</i>
<b>famine</b>	Hunger. <i>The cotton <b>famine</b> of the 1860s.</i>
<b>hunger</b>	Feel or suffer hunger. <i>When he had fasted forty days and forty nights he afterwards <b>hungered</b>.</i>
<b>inadequacy</b>	Inability to deal with a situation or with life. <i>Juvenile offenses often reflect an <b>inadequacy</b> in the parents.</i>
<b>indispensability</b>	The quality possessed by something that you cannot possibly do without.
<b>indispensable</b>	Absolutely necessary. <i>An <b>indispensable</b> worker.</i>
<b>insufficiency</b>	Inability of a bodily part or organ to function normally. <i>Renal <b>insufficiency</b>.</i>
<b>integral</b>	The result of a mathematical integration $F x$ is the integral of $f x$ if $dF dx = f x$ . <i>The first <b>integral</b> recording of the ten Mahler symphonies.</i>
<b>lack</b>	Be without or deficient in. <i>There is a <b>lack</b> of parking space in the town.</i>

<b>necessary</b>	Unavoidably determined by prior circumstances. <i>They granted the <b>necessary</b> planning permission.</i>
<b><u>necessitate</u></b>	Make (something) necessary as a result or consequence. <i>The late arrival had <b>necessitated</b> her getting out of bed.</i>
<b>necessity</b>	The condition of being essential or indispensable. <i>A good book is a <b>necessity</b> when travelling.</i>
<b>needs</b>	Of necessity. <i>We must <b>needs</b> by objective.</i>
<b>obligate</b>	Commit (assets) as security. <i>An <b>obligate</b> anaerobe can survive only in the absence of oxygen.</i>
<b>oblige</b>	Make (someone) legally or morally bound to do something. <i>Tell me what you want to know and I ll see if I can <b>oblige</b>.</i>
<b>perforce</b>	By necessity; by force of circumstance. <i>Amateurs <b>perforce</b> have to settle for less expensive solutions.</i>
<b><u>prerequisite</u></b>	Required as a prior condition or course of study. <i>Latin was a <b>prerequisite</b> for admission.</i>
<b>request</b>	The verbal act of requesting. <i>To have our ideas taken seriously is surely a reasonable <b>request</b>.</i>
<b>require</b>	Require as useful just or proper. <i>Please indicate how many tickets you <b>require</b>.</i>
<b>required</b>	Required by rule. <i><b>Required</b> reading.</i>
<b>requisite</b>	A thing that is necessary for the achievement of a specified end. <i>The application will not be processed until the <b>requisite</b> fee is paid.</i>
<b>scarcity</b>	The state of being scarce or in short supply; shortage. <i>A time of <b>scarcity</b>.</i>
<b><u>shortage</u></b>	A state or situation in which something needed cannot be obtained in sufficient amounts. <i>Food <b>shortages</b>.</i>
<b>shortfall</b>	A deficit of something required or expected. <i>They are facing an expected 10 billion <b>shortfall</b> in revenue.</i>
<b><u>vital</u></b>	The body's important internal organs. <i>Blood and other <b>vital</b> fluids.</i>
<b>want</b>	Feel or have a desire for want strongly. <i>Your former neighbor is <b>wanted</b> by the FBI.</i>
