| abbreviate | Shorten. <i>Network is often abbreviated to net.</i> |
| abbreviated | Very short. <i>The abbreviated speech.</i> |
| abbreviation | A shortened form of a word or phrase. <i>SKU is the abbreviation for Stock Keeping Unit.</i> |
| abscond | (of a colony of honeybees, especially Africanized ones) entirely abandon a hive or nest. <i>The barman absconded with a week s takings.</i> |
| brief | Instruct a barrister by brief. <i>The president made a brief working visit to Moscow.</i> |
| concise | Expressing much in few words. <i>A concise account of the country s history.</i> |
| ephemeral | An ephemeral plant. <i>Chickweed is an ephemeral weed producing several generations in one season.</i> |
| fleeting | Lasting for a markedly brief time. <i>For a fleeting moment I saw the face of a boy.</i> |
| fugitive | A person who has escaped from captivity or is in hiding. <i>The fugitive effects of light.</i> |
| insufficient | Not enough; inadequate. <i>Insufficient funds.</i> |
| interlude | Perform an interlude. <i>An orchestral interlude.</i> |
| lacking | (of a quality) absent. <i>Her appetite was lacking.</i> |

| momentary | Lasting for a very short time; brief. <i>A momentary glimpse.</i> |
| overview | Give a general review or summary of. <i>A brief overview of the survey.</i> |
| paucity | The presence of something in only small or insufficient quantities or amounts. <i>A paucity of information.</i> |
| provisional | A provisional stamp. <i>Norman as yet had only a provisional licence.</i> |
| provisory | Provisional. <i>A provisory clause.</i> |
| scant | Barely sufficient or adequate. <i>A scant cup of sugar.</i> |
| sojourn | Spend a certain length of time; reside temporarily. <i>Her sojourn in Rome.</i> |
| stopgap | A temporary way of dealing with a problem or satisfying a need. <i>Transplants are only a stopgap until more sophisticated alternatives can work.</i> |
| stopover | A break in a journey. <i>Easy vehicle access makes the spot a favourite stopover for camper vanners.</i> |
| succinct | Briefly giving the gist of something. <i>Use short succinct sentences.</i> |
| summary | A brief statement that presents the main points in a concise form. <i>Summary justice.</i> |
| temporary | A person employed on a temporary basis typically an office worker who finds employment through an agency. <i>Employed on a temporary basis.</i> |
| terse | Sparing in the use of words; abrupt. <i>A terse statement.</i> |
| transient | Staying or working in a place for a short time only. <i>A transient cold spell.</i> |
| transitory | Lasting a very short time. <i>Love is transitory but it is eternal.</i> |
| truce | A state of peace agreed to between opponents so they can discuss peace terms. <i>The guerrillas called a three day truce.</i> |

- truncate** Approximate by ignoring all terms beyond a chosen one.
*The torso has been **truncated** just below the neck line.*
- wanting** Lacking in a required or necessary quality.
*Mandibles are **wanting** in many of these insects.*
