internal Inside the body. *Internal organs.*

inwardly Within the mind.

Inwardly seething he did as he was told.

malevolence Wishing evil to others.

His eyes were glowing with malevolence.

malice The desire to harm someone; ill will. *I bear no malice towards anybody.*

malicious Characterized by malice; intending or intended to do harm.

A hotbed of rumour and **malicious** chit chat.

maliciousness Feeling a need to see others suffer.

rancor A feeling of deep and bitter anger and ill-will.

rancour Bitterness or resentfulness, especially when long standing.

He spoke without rancour.

resentment A feeling of deep and bitter anger and ill-will.

Some people harbour **resentment**s going back many years.

Take revenge for a perceived wrong.

The blow stung and she **retaliate**d immediately.

Inflict revenge on behalf of someone else.

vendetta

A feud in which members of the opposing parties murder each other.

He has accused the British media of pursuing a **vendetta** against him.

Punishment inflicted or retribution exacted for an injury or wrong.

revenge.

venom Feeling a need to see others suffer.

Snake **venom**s have different effects.

wickedness The quality of being wicked.

The **wickedness** of the regime.

within Inside; indoors.

wreak Cause to happen or to occur as a consequence.

The environmental damage **wreak**ed by ninety years of phosphate mining.
