Associations of "In spite of" (30 Words)

acrimony	Bitterness or ill feeling. <i>The AGM dissolved into acrimony.</i>
aggression	Violent action that is hostile and usually unprovoked. <i>The president has been emboldened by the success of his latest aggressions.</i>
animosity	Strong hostility. <i>He no longer felt any animosity towards her.</i>
antagonism	Active hostility or opposition. <i>His antagonism towards the local people.</i>
avenge	Inflict harm in return for an injury or wrong on behalf of (oneself or another). <i>He wants to avenge the murder of his brother.</i>
enmity	The feeling of a hostile person. <i>Decades of enmity between the two countries.</i>
feud	Carry out a feud. <i>A savage feud over drugs money.</i>
grievance	An allegation that something imposes an illegal obligation or denies some legal right or causes injustice. <i>Three pilots have filed grievances against the company.</i>
grudge	Bear a grudge harbor ill feelings. <i>He grudged the work and time that the meeting involved.</i>
hatred	Intense dislike; hate. <i>Racial hatred.</i>
hostility	Violent action that is hostile and usually unprovoked. <i>Their hostility to all outsiders.</i>
inner	A shot that strikes the inner. <i>Privy to inner knowledge.</i>

interior	Situated on or relating to the inside of something; inner. <i>The interior has been much restored.</i>
internal	Inside the body. <i>Internal organs.</i>
inwardly	Within the mind. <i>Inwardly seething he did as he was told.</i>
malevolence	Wishing evil to others. <i>His eyes were glowing with malevolence.</i>
malice	The desire to harm someone; ill will. <i>I bear no malice towards anybody.</i>
malicious	Characterized by malice; intending or intended to do harm. <i>A hotbed of rumour and malicious chit chat.</i>
maliciousness	Feeling a need to see others suffer.
rancor	A feeling of deep and bitter anger and ill-will.
rancour	Bitterness or resentfulness, especially when long standing. <i>He spoke without rancour.</i>
resentment	A feeling of deep and bitter anger and ill-will. <i>Some people harbour resentments going back many years.</i>
retaliate	Take revenge for a perceived wrong. <i>The blow stung and she retaliated immediately.</i>
revenge	Inflict revenge on behalf of someone else. <i>It s a pity he chose that way to revenge his sister.</i>
vendetta	A feud in which members of the opposing parties murder each other. <i>He has accused the British media of pursuing a vendetta against him.</i>
vengeance	Punishment inflicted or retribution exacted for an injury or wrong. <i>For vengeance I would do nothing This nation is too great to look for mere revenge.</i>
venom	Feeling a need to see others suffer. <i>Snake venoms have different effects.</i>
wickedness	The quality of being wicked. <i>The wickedness of the regime.</i>
within	Inside; indoors. <i>Beauty coming from within.</i>
wreak	Cause to happen or to occur as a consequence. <i>The environmental damage wreaked by ninety years of phosphate mining.</i>
