## Associations of "In spite of" (30 Words)

<b>acrimony</b>	Bitterness or ill feeling. <i>The AGM dissolved into <b>acrimony</b>.</i>
<b>aggression</b>	Violent action that is hostile and usually unprovoked. <i>The president has been emboldened by the success of his latest <b>aggressions</b>.</i>
<b>animosity</b>	Strong hostility. <i>He no longer felt any <b>animosity</b> towards her.</i>
<b>antagonism</b>	Active hostility or opposition. <i>His <b>antagonism</b> towards the local people.</i>
<a href="#">avenge</a>	Inflict harm in return for an injury or wrong on behalf of (oneself or another). <i>He wants to <b>avenge</b> the murder of his brother.</i>
<a href="#">enmity</a>	The feeling of a hostile person. <i>Decades of <b>enmity</b> between the two countries.</i>
<a href="#">feud</a>	Carry out a feud. <i>A savage <b>feud</b> over drugs money.</i>
<a href="#">grievance</a>	An allegation that something imposes an illegal obligation or denies some legal right or causes injustice. <i>Three pilots have filed <b>grievances</b> against the company.</i>
<b>grudge</b>	Bear a grudge harbor ill feelings. <i>He <b>grudged</b> the work and time that the meeting involved.</i>
<a href="#">hatred</a>	Intense dislike; hate. <i>Racial <b>hatred</b>.</i>
<a href="#">hostility</a>	Violent action that is hostile and usually unprovoked. <i>Their <b>hostility</b> to all outsiders.</i>
<b>inner</b>	A shot that strikes the inner. <i>Privy to <b>inner</b> knowledge.</i>

<b>interior</b>	Situated on or relating to the inside of something; inner. <i>The <b>interior</b> has been much restored.</i>
<b>internal</b>	Inside the body. <i><b>Internal</b> organs.</i>
<b>inwardly</b>	Within the mind. <i><b>Inwardly</b> seething he did as he was told.</i>
<b>malevolence</b>	Wishing evil to others. <i>His eyes were glowing with <b>malevolence</b>.</i>
<b>malice</b>	The desire to harm someone; ill will. <i>I bear no <b>malice</b> towards anybody.</i>
<b>malicious</b>	Characterized by malice; intending or intended to do harm. <i>A hotbed of rumour and <b>malicious</b> chit chat.</i>
<b>maliciousness</b>	Feeling a need to see others suffer.
<b>rancor</b>	A feeling of deep and bitter anger and ill-will.
<b>rancour</b>	Bitterness or resentfulness, especially when long standing. <i>He spoke without <b>rancour</b>.</i>
<b>resentment</b>	A feeling of deep and bitter anger and ill-will. <i>Some people harbour <b>resentments</b> going back many years.</i>
<b>retaliate</b>	Take revenge for a perceived wrong. <i>The blow stung and she <b>retaliated</b> immediately.</i>
<b>revenge</b>	Inflict revenge on behalf of someone else. <i>It s a pity he chose that way to <b>revenge</b> his sister.</i>
<b>vendetta</b>	A feud in which members of the opposing parties murder each other. <i>He has accused the British media of pursuing a <b>vendetta</b> against him.</i>
<b>vengeance</b>	Punishment inflicted or retribution exacted for an injury or wrong. <i>For <b>vengeance</b> I would do nothing This nation is too great to look for mere revenge.</i>
<b>venom</b>	Feeling a need to see others suffer. <i>Snake <b>venoms</b> have different effects.</i>
<b>wickedness</b>	The quality of being wicked. <i>The <b>wickedness</b> of the regime.</i>
<b>within</b>	Inside; indoors. <i>Beauty coming from <b>within</b>.</i>
<b>wreak</b>	Cause to happen or to occur as a consequence. <i>The environmental damage <b>wreaked</b> by ninety years of phosphate mining.</i>
