beyond	In addition. <i>Music went on into the night and beyond.</i>
bypass	An alternative channel created during a bypass operation. <i>The town has been bypassed.</i>
circumvent	Deceive; outwit. <i>If you come to an obstruction in a road you can seek to circumvent it.</i>
detour	Avoid by taking a detour. <i>I would detour the endless stream of motor homes.</i>
distance	The distance from the winning post which a horse must have reached when the winner finishes in order to qualify for a subsequent heat. <i>The distance from birth to death.</i>
elongate	Long in relation to width elongated. <i>The old man s gaunt and elongated frame.</i>
elongated	Drawn out or made longer spatially. <i>Picasso s elongated Don Quixote.</i>
endlessly	With unflagging resolve. <i>The original episodes were endlessly repeated.</i>
enduring	Patiently bearing continual wrongs or trouble. <i>He formed a number of enduring relationships with women.</i>
entree	The act of entering. <i>She made a graceful entree into the ballroom.</i>
extend	Continue or extend. <i>The disease extended into the remote mountain provinces.</i>
extended	Fully extended or stretched forth. <i>His extended legs reached almost across the small room.</i>
extensible	Able to be extended or stretched; extendable. <i>In a second she was out of the car extensible baton in hand.</i>

furlong	An eighth of a mile, 220 yards.
further	To or at a greater distance in time or space farther is used more frequently than further in this physical sense. <i>Before going any further we need to define our terms.</i>
hie	Move hurriedly. <i>I hied down to New Orleans.</i>
indefinitely	For an unlimited or unspecified period of time. <i>Talks cannot go on indefinitely.</i>
indoor	Relating to sports played indoors. <i>Indoor activities for a rainy day.</i>
interminable	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>An interminable sermon.</i>
length	The length of a horse boat etc as a measure of the lead in a race. <i>The length of the table was 5 feet.</i>
lengthen	Make or become longer. <i>In the spring when the days are lengthening.</i>
lengthy	(especially in reference to time) of considerable or unusual length, especially so as to be tedious. <i>A lengthy visit from her mother in law.</i>
marathon	A footrace of 26 miles 385 yards. <i>The last leg of an interview marathon which began this summer.</i>
postpone	Cause or arrange for (something) to take place at a time later than that first scheduled. <i>The visit had to be postponed for some time.</i>
prolonged	Drawn out or made longer spatially. <i>A prolonged black line across the page.</i>
protracted	Relatively long in duration tediously protracted. <i>Protracted negotiations.</i>
running	The act of running traveling on foot at a fast pace. <i>Cost of lumber per running foot.</i>
spread	Cover by spreading something over. <i>Spread the bread with cheese.</i>
stretched	Extended or spread over a wide area or distance. <i>Broad fields lay stretched on both sides of us.</i>
upstage	Move upstage forcing the other actors to turn away from the audience. <i>He was upstage with strangers.</i>
