<a href="#">beyond</a>	In addition. <i>Music went on into the night and <b>beyond</b>.</i>
<a href="#">bypass</a>	An alternative channel created during a bypass operation. <i>The town has been <b>bypassed</b>.</i>
<b>circumvent</b>	Deceive; outwit. <i>If you come to an obstruction in a road you can seek to <b>circumvent</b> it.</i>
<a href="#">detour</a>	Avoid by taking a detour. <i>I would <b>detour</b> the endless stream of motor homes.</i>
<a href="#">distance</a>	The distance from the winning post which a horse must have reached when the winner finishes in order to qualify for a subsequent heat. <i>The <b>distance</b> from birth to death.</i>
<b>elongate</b>	Long in relation to width elongated. <i>The old man s gaunt and <b>elongated</b> frame.</i>
<a href="#">elongated</a>	Drawn out or made longer spatially. <i>Picasso s <b>elongated</b> Don Quixote.</i>
<a href="#">endlessly</a>	With unflagging resolve. <i>The original episodes were <b>endlessly</b> repeated.</i>
<a href="#">enduring</a>	Patiently bearing continual wrongs or trouble. <i>He formed a number of <b>enduring</b> relationships with women.</i>
<b>entree</b>	The act of entering. <i>She made a graceful <b>entree</b> into the ballroom.</i>
<a href="#">extend</a>	Continue or extend. <i>The disease <b>extended</b> into the remote mountain provinces.</i>
<b>extended</b>	Fully extended or stretched forth. <i>His <b>extended</b> legs reached almost across the small room.</i>
<b>extensible</b>	Able to be extended or stretched; extendable. <i>In a second she was out of the car <b>extensible</b> baton in hand.</i>

<b>furlong</b>	An eighth of a mile, 220 yards.
<b>further</b>	To or at a greater distance in time or space farther is used more frequently than further in this physical sense. <i>Before going any <b>further</b> we need to define our terms.</i>
<b>hie</b>	Move hurriedly. <i>I <b>hied</b> down to New Orleans.</i>
<b>indefinitely</b>	For an unlimited or unspecified period of time. <i>Talks cannot go on <b>indefinitely</b>.</i>
<b>indoor</b>	Relating to sports played indoors. <i><b>Indoor</b> activities for a rainy day.</i>
<b>interminable</b>	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>An <b>interminable</b> sermon.</i>
<b>length</b>	The length of a horse boat etc as a measure of the lead in a race. <i>The <b>length</b> of the table was 5 feet.</i>
<b>lengthen</b>	Make or become longer. <i>In the spring when the days are <b>lengthening</b>.</i>
<b>lengthy</b>	(especially in reference to time) of considerable or unusual length, especially so as to be tedious. <i>A <b>lengthy</b> visit from her mother in law.</i>
<b>marathon</b>	A footrace of 26 miles 385 yards. <i>The last leg of an interview <b>marathon</b> which began this summer.</i>
<b>postpone</b>	Cause or arrange for (something) to take place at a time later than that first scheduled. <i>The visit had to be <b>postponed</b> for some time.</i>
<b>prolonged</b>	Drawn out or made longer spatially. <i>A <b>prolonged</b> black line across the page.</i>
<b>protracted</b>	Relatively long in duration tediously protracted. <i><b>Protracted</b> negotiations.</i>
<b>running</b>	The act of running traveling on foot at a fast pace. <i>Cost of lumber per <b>running</b> foot.</i>
<b>spread</b>	Cover by spreading something over. <i><b>Spread</b> the bread with cheese.</i>
<b>stretched</b>	Extended or spread over a wide area or distance. <i>Broad fields lay <b>stretched</b> on both sides of us.</i>
<b>upstage</b>	Move upstage forcing the other actors to turn away from the audience. <i>He was <b>upstage</b> with strangers.</i>
