indoor	Relating to sports played indoors. <i>Indoor activities for a rainy day.</i>
indoors	Within a building. <i>They went indoors and explored the house.</i>
inmost	Situated or occurring farthest within.
inner	A shot that strikes the inner. <i>An inner room.</i>
inside	On the inside. <i>Overtaking on the inside.</i>

interior	Existing or taking place in the mind or soul; mental. <i>The interior has been much restored.</i>
internal	Inside the body. <i>Internal party maneuvering.</i>
intramural	Forming part of normal university or college studies. <i>Both intramural and churchyard graves.</i>
inwardly	Within the mind. <i>Inwardly seething he did as he was told.</i>
midnight	12 o'clock at night; the middle of the night. <i>I left at midnight.</i>
monday	The second day of the week; the first working day.
morning	Every morning. <i>A hint of steely light showed that morning was on its way.</i>
noon	Twelve o'clock in the day; midday. <i>The service starts at twelve noon.</i>
o'clock	According to the clock.
rouse	Cause to be agitated excited or roused. <i>She roused and looked around.</i>
sunday	United States evangelist (1862-1935).
therein	In that place, document, or respect. <i>The student has not been resident therein.</i>
tonight	On the present or approaching evening or night. <i>Are you doing anything tonight.</i>
twilight	Lighted by or as if by twilight Henry Fielding. <i>He loved the twilight.</i>
waken	Cause to become awake or conscious. <i>She knew he would waken in an hour or so.</i>
wednesday	The fourth day of the week; the third working day.
within	Inside; indoors. <i>Enquire within.</i>
