| access | Reach or gain access to. <i>This prevents unauthorized access or inadvertent deletion of the file.</i> |
| accessible | (of a person, especially one in a position of authority) friendly and easy to talk to; approachable. <i>This room is not accessible to elderly people.</i> |
| acknowledgement | The expression of gratitude or appreciation for something. <i>He received an award in acknowledgement of his work.</i> |
| admission | The fee charged for admission. <i>There was a substantial reduction in hospital admissions.</i> |
| admittance | The act of admitting someone to enter. <i>People were unable to gain admittance to the hall.</i> |
| applicable | Capable of being applied; having relevance. <i>The same considerations are equally applicable to accident claims.</i> |
| opposite | Apt in the circumstances or in relation to something. <i>The observations are opposite to the discussion.</i> |
| appropriate | Give or assign a resource to a particular person or cause. <i>The accused had appropriated the property.</i> |
| apropos | Of an appropriate or pertinent nature. <i>The composer's reference to child's play is apropos.</i> |
| befit | Be appropriate for; suit. <i>As befits a Quaker he was a humane man.</i> |
| comer | A person or thing likely to succeed. <i>Many in the party see tax relief as a comer.</i> |
| correct | Correct in opinion or judgment. <i>The new contact lenses will correct for his myopia.</i> |
| dispossess | (in sport) deprive (a player) of the ball. <i>He dispossessed Hendrie and set off on a solo run.</i> |

| eligible | Having the right to do or obtain something; satisfying the appropriate conditions. <i>The world s most eligible bachelor.</i> |
| entree | The act of entering. <i>She made a graceful entree into the ballroom.</i> |
| entry | The forward part of a ship's hull below the waterline, considered in terms of breadth or narrowness. <i>Sophisticated features to help ensure accurate data entry.</i> |
| fit | Be the right size or shape fit correctly or as desired. <i>A fit of housecleaning.</i> |
| fitting | The action of fitting something. <i>A fitting reward.</i> |
| germane | Relevant to a subject under consideration. <i>He asks questions that are germane and central to the issue.</i> |
| just | Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>A just and democratic society.</i> |
| justification | The action of declaring or making righteous in the sight of God. <i>There is no justification for an increase in charges.</i> |
| legitimate | Show or affirm to be just and legitimate. <i>A legitimate government.</i> |
| opportune | Done or occurring at a favourable time; well timed. <i>An opportune place to make camp.</i> |
| pertinent | Relevant or applicable to a particular matter; apposite. <i>She asked me a lot of very pertinent questions.</i> |
| proper | Strictly so called; in its true form. <i>Her parents view of what was proper for a well bred girl.</i> |
| punctual | Acting or arriving or performed exactly at the time appointed. <i>She expected guests to be punctual at meals.</i> |
| realization | Something that is made real or concrete. <i>A growing realization of the need to create common economic structures.</i> |
| relevant | Closely connected or appropriate to what is being done or considered. <i>The scientist corresponds with colleagues in order to learn about matters relevant to her own research.</i> |
| rightness | Conformity with some esthetic standard of correctness or propriety. <i>The rightness of that move for me.</i> |
