## Associations of "In turn" (30 Words)

<b><u>bent</u></b>	Used of the back and knees; stooped. <i>A missionary <b>bent</b> on saving souls.</i>
<b><u>circle</u></b>	Something in the shape of a circle. <i>She sat in the front row of the <b>circle</b>.</i>
<b>contort</b>	Twist or bend out of the normal shape. <i>A <b>contorted</b> version of the truth.</i>
<b>convolute</b>	Make (an argument, story, etc.) complex and difficult to follow. <i>A <b>convolute</b> petal.</i>
<b>convolve</b>	Combine (one function or series) with another by forming their convolution.
<b><u>curve</u></b>	Extend in curves and turns. <i>The vehicle rounded a <b>curve</b>.</i>
<b>cycloid</b>	A curve (resembling a series of arches) traced by a point on a circle being rolled along a straight line.
<b><u>distorted</u></b>	Having an intended meaning altered or misrepresented. <i>His poor <b>distorted</b> limbs.</i>
<b>garble</b>	A garbled account or transmission. <i>Upon winning a race a driver spews out a litany of commercial <b>garble</b>.</i>
<b><u>hooked</u></b>	Devoted to or absorbed in something. <i>A golden eagle with <b>hooked</b> beak.</i>
<b>kink</b>	Form a curl curve or kink. <i>A <b>kink</b> in the road.</i>
<b><u>morbid</u></b>	Suggesting an unhealthy mental state. <i><b>Morbid</b> curiosity.</i>
<b><u>revolve</u></b>	Turn on or around an axis or a center. <i>Their whole lives <b>revolved</b> around the company.</i>
<b>sinuous</b>	Having many curves and turns. <i>The river follows a <b>sinuous</b> trail through the dale.</i>

<b>skew</b>	Neither parallel nor at right angles to a specified or implied line askew crooked. <i>The distributions were <b>skewed</b> to the right.</i>
<b>slew</b>	Of an electronic device undergo slewing. <i>He <b>slew</b> the aircraft round before it settled on the runway.</i>
<b>somersault</b>	Do a somersault. <i>His car <b>somersaulted</b> into a ditch.</i>
<b>spin</b>	Cause to spin. <i>Spiders <b>spin</b> a fine web.</i>
<b>spiraling</b>	In the shape of a coil.
<b>swerve</b>	An abrupt change of direction. <i>A lorry <b>swerved</b> across her path.</i>
<b>torque</b>	Apply torque or a twisting force to an object. <i>He gently <b>torqued</b> the hip joint.</i>
<b>twist</b>	Dance the twist. <i>The taps needed a single <b>twist</b> to turn them on.</i>
<b>twisted</b>	(of a joint) injured by wrenching; sprained. <i>Many of the facts seemed <b>twisted</b> out of any semblance to reality.</i>
<b>warped</b>	Abnormal or strange; distorted. <i>The floors were <b>warped</b> and cracked.</i>
<b>whirl</b>	Flow in a circular current, of liquids. <i>A hazelnut <b>whirl</b>.</i>
<b>wind</b>	A scent carried by the wind indicating the presence or proximity of an animal or person. <i><b>Wind</b> your watch.</i>
<b>worm</b>	Treat an animal with a preparation designed to expel parasitic worms. <i>I did manage to <b>worm</b> a few details out of him.</i>
<b>wrench</b>	Turn something especially a nut or bolt with a wrench. <i><b>Wrench</b> one's ankle.</i>
<b>wrest</b>	Take (something, especially power or control) after considerable effort or difficulty. <i>You appear convinced of my guilt and <b>wrest</b> every reply I have made.</i>
<b>wry</b>	Using or expressing dry, especially mocking, humour. <i>A remedy for <b>wry</b> necks.</i>
