Associations of "In turn" (30 Words)

bent	Used of the back and knees; stooped. <i>A missionary bent on saving souls.</i>
circle	Something in the shape of a circle. <i>She sat in the front row of the circle.</i>
contort	Twist or bend out of the normal shape. <i>A contorted version of the truth.</i>
convolute	Make (an argument, story, etc.) complex and difficult to follow. <i>A convolute petal.</i>
convolve	Combine (one function or series) with another by forming their convolution.
curve	Extend in curves and turns. <i>The vehicle rounded a curve.</i>
cycloid	A curve (resembling a series of arches) traced by a point on a circle being rolled along a straight line.
distorted	Having an intended meaning altered or misrepresented. <i>His poor distorted limbs.</i>
garble	A garbled account or transmission. <i>Upon winning a race a driver spews out a litany of commercial garble.</i>
hooked	Devoted to or absorbed in something. <i>A golden eagle with hooked beak.</i>
kink	Form a curl curve or kink. <i>A kink in the road.</i>
morbid	Suggesting an unhealthy mental state. <i>Morbid curiosity.</i>
revolve	Turn on or around an axis or a center. <i>Their whole lives revolved around the company.</i>
sinuous	Having many curves and turns. <i>The river follows a sinuous trail through the dale.</i>

skew	Neither parallel nor at right angles to a specified or implied line askew crooked. <i>The distributions were skewed to the right.</i>
slew	Of an electronic device undergo slewing. <i>He slew the aircraft round before it settled on the runway.</i>
somersault	Do a somersault. <i>His car somersaulted into a ditch.</i>
spin	Cause to spin. <i>Spiders spin a fine web.</i>
spiraling	In the shape of a coil.
swerve	An abrupt change of direction. <i>A lorry swerved across her path.</i>
torque	Apply torque or a twisting force to an object. <i>He gently torqued the hip joint.</i>
twist	Dance the twist. <i>The taps needed a single twist to turn them on.</i>
twisted	(of a joint) injured by wrenching; sprained. <i>Many of the facts seemed twisted out of any semblance to reality.</i>
warped	Abnormal or strange; distorted. <i>The floors were warped and cracked.</i>
whirl	Flow in a circular current, of liquids. <i>A hazelnut whirl.</i>
wind	A scent carried by the wind indicating the presence or proximity of an animal or person. <i>Wind your watch.</i>
worm	Treat an animal with a preparation designed to expel parasitic worms. <i>I did manage to worm a few details out of him.</i>
wrench	Turn something especially a nut or bolt with a wrench. <i>Wrench one's ankle.</i>
wrest	Take (something, especially power or control) after considerable effort or difficulty. <i>You appear convinced of my guilt and wrest every reply I have made.</i>
wry	Using or expressing dry, especially mocking, humour. <i>A remedy for wry necks.</i>
