inapt Not elegant or graceful in expression. *A more* inapt name I cannot imagine.

incorrect Not correct; not in conformity with fact or truth.

An **incorrect** transcription.

inexact Not exact.

An **inexact** description.

**misconception** An incorrect conception. *Public misconceptions about antibiotic use.*

*Voters were* **misdirect**ed to the wrong polling station.

misquide Give bad advice to.

A long survey that can only baffle and **misguide** the general reader.

misinterpret Interpret falsely.

Don t **misinterpret** my comments as criticism.

**misleading** Giving the wrong idea or impression.

Your article contains a number of **misleading** statements.

Wrong in one's opinion or judgement.
