Inadvertently as an Adverb

Definitions of "Inadvertently" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “inadvertently” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Without knowledge or intention.*
- *Without intention; accidentally.*

Synonyms of "Inadvertently" as an adverb (5 Words)

accidentally	By chance; inadvertently. <i>Accidentally knocked the vase over.</i>
by accident	In reserve; not for immediate use.
<u>unintentionally</u>	Without intention; in an unintentional manner. <i>I may have unintentionally misled some of you.</i>
<u>unknowingly</u>	Without knowledge or intention. <i>Every day we are unknowingly exposed to a variety of pesticides.</i>
unwittingly	Without being aware; unintentionally. <i>He unwittingly deleted the references.</i>

Usage Examples of "Inadvertently" as an adverb

- *His name had been inadvertently omitted from the list.*

Associations of "Inadvertently" (30 Words)

<u>accident</u>	Anything that happens suddenly or by chance without an apparent cause. <i>He had a little accident but I washed his shorts out.</i>
accidentally	Without advance planning. <i>They met accidentally.</i>
blurt	Utter impulsively. <i>He blurted out the secret.</i>
carelessly	In a rakish manner. <i>Carelessly raised the children s hopes without thinking of their possible disappointment.</i>
casually	Not methodically or according to plan. <i>I wouldn t introduce my family to people I was casually dating.</i>
<u>coincide</u>	Occur at the same time. <i>The members of the College coincide in this opinion.</i>
<u>coincidence</u>	A remarkable concurrence of events or circumstances without apparent causal connection. <i>The interval determining the coincidence gate is adjustable.</i>
<u>contemporaneous</u>	Existing at or occurring in the same period of time. <i>A rise in interest rates is often contemporaneous with an increase in inflation.</i>
exist	Have an existence be extant. <i>He could barely exist on such a low wage.</i>
hap	An accidental happening. <i>What is happening.</i>
happen	Happen occur or be the case in the course of events or by chance. <i>Two hours had passed and still nothing had happened.</i>
happenstance	An event that might have been arranged although it was really accidental. <i>It was just happenstance that I happened to be there.</i>
<u>incident</u>	(especially of light or other radiation) falling on or striking something. <i>One person was stabbed in the incident.</i>

incidental	An incidental expense event etc. <i>Confusion incidental to a quick change.</i>
incidentally	In an incidental manner; as a chance occurrence. <i>Incidentally I won't go to the party.</i>
just	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>I just can't take it anymore.</i>
occur	Exist or be found to be present in a place or under a particular set of conditions. <i>The accident occurred at about 3 30 p m.</i>
overhear	Hear, usually without the knowledge of the speakers. <i>We overheard the conversation at the next table.</i>
simultaneously	At the same time. <i>The telethon was broadcast simultaneously on 31 US networks.</i>
synchronism	The relation that exists when things occur at the same time.
unaware	(often followed by 'of') not aware. <i>Seemed unaware of the scrutiny.</i>
unconsciously	Without realizing or being aware of one's actions. <i>Ben smiled unconsciously when he heard her voice.</i>
unexpected	Not expected or regarded as likely to happen. <i>Unexpected guests.</i>
unexpectedly	In a way that was not expected or regarded as likely. <i>He died unexpectedly of a heart attack.</i>
unintended	Not planned or meant. <i>The unintended consequences of people's actions.</i>
unintentionally	Without intention; in an unintentional manner. <i>Unintentionally rude song lyrics.</i>
unknowingly	Without knowledge or intention. <i>Every day we are unknowingly exposed to a variety of pesticides.</i>
unknown	An unknown person or thing. <i>They came like angels out the unknown.</i>
unwittingly	Without knowledge or intention. <i>He unwittingly deleted the references.</i>
