Definitions of "Incarnation" as a noun

- *A new personification of a familiar idea.*
- *The Christian doctrine of the union of God and man in the person of Jesus Christ.*
- *(with reference to reincarnation) each of a series of earthly lifetimes.*
- *The act of attributing human characteristics to abstract ideas etc.*
- *Time passed in a particular bodily form.*
- *(Christianity) the Christian doctrine of the union of God and man in the person of Jesus Christ.*
- *A person who embodies in the flesh a deity, spirit, or quality.*
- *(in Christian theology) the embodiment of God the Son in human flesh as Jesus Christ.*
- *The form taken by a person or thing during an incarnation.*



Synonyms of "Incarnation" as a noun (9 Words)

avatar	An icon or figure representing a particular person in a video game, internet forum, etc. <i>The very avatar of cunning.</i>
embodiment	The representation or expression of something in a tangible or visible form. <i>A circle was the embodiment of his concept of life.</i>
<u>epitome</u>	A person or thing that is a perfect example of a particular quality or type. <i>She looked the epitome of elegance and good taste.</i>
exemplification	Showing by example.
existence	A way of living. <i>He believed in the essential unity of all existence.</i>
life	An account of the series of events making up a person's life. <i>I have known him all his life.</i>

lifetime

The period during which something is functional (as between birth and death).

*Fifteen shops closed during the **lifetime** of the scheme.*

personification

A person who represents an abstract quality.

*She is the **personification** of optimism.*

type

Metal types used in letterpress printing.

*She characterized his witty sayings as the **type** of modern wisdom.*

- *Rama was Vishnu's incarnation on earth.*
- *He believes that his life will be better in his next incarnation.*

avatar	A new personification of a familiar idea. <i>He chose John Stuart Mill as the avatar of the liberal view.</i>
being	Being alive living. <i>A point of view gradually coming into being.</i>
carnal	Marked by the appetites and passions of the body. <i>Carnal desire.</i>
deadly	Causing or able to cause death. <i>Her skin was deadly pale.</i>
destine	Design or destined. <i>She was destined to become a great pianist.</i>
devastating	Physically or spiritually devastating often used in combination. <i>A devastating cyclone.</i>

<u>doom</u>	(in Christian belief) the Last Judgement. <i>This decision will doom me to lose my position.</i>
embodiment	The representation or expression of something in a tangible or visible form. <i>The embodiment of hope.</i>
<u>embody</u>	Include or contain (something) as a constituent part. <i>Nothing of the personality of the Spirit as embodied in Jesus will be lost.</i>
<u>existential</u>	Of or as conceived by existentialism. <i>Formal logicians are not concerned with existential matters.</i>
<u>fatal</u>	Having momentous consequences; of decisive importance. <i>The fatal day of the election finally arrived.</i>
<u>harmful</u>	Causing or likely to cause harm. <i>Sugars which can be harmful to the teeth.</i>
humankind	Human beings considered collectively (used as a neutral alternative to 'mankind'). <i>She always used humankind because mankind seemed to slight the women.</i>
incarnate	Possessing or existing in bodily form- Shakespeare. <i>The idea that God incarnates himself in man.</i>
<u>inhabit</u>	Be an inhabitant of or reside in. <i>The region was inhabited by Indians.</i>
<u>lethal</u>	Of an instrument of certain death. <i>The Krakatoa eruption was the most lethal on record.</i>
life	An account of the series of events making up a person's life. <i>The valley is teeming with bird life.</i>
<u>lifelong</u>	Continuing through life. <i>The two men were to remain lifelong friends.</i>
<u>lifetime</u>	The period during which something is functional (as between birth and death). <i>A reward for a lifetime's work.</i>
live	Lead a certain kind of life live in a certain style. <i>The happiest person alive.</i>
mortal	A human being subject to death, as opposed to a divine being. <i>A mortal illness.</i>
outlive	(of a person) live longer than (another person). <i>She outlived her husband by many years.</i>

<u>pernicious</u>	Having a harmful effect, especially in a gradual or subtle way. <i>The pernicious influences of the mass media.</i>
personification	A figure intended to represent an abstract quality. <i>The book provides a sustained account of how literary personification works.</i>
predestination	(theology) being determined in advance; especially the doctrine (usually associated with Calvin) that God has foreordained every event throughout eternity (including the final salvation of mankind).
predestine	Foreordain or determine beforehand. <i>She was certain that fate was with her and everything was predestined.</i>
<u>reincarnation</u>	Embodiment in a new form (especially the reappearance of a person in another form). <i>His reincarnation as a lion.</i>
represent	Be a delegate or spokesperson for represent somebody's interest or be a proxy or substitute for as of politicians and office holders representing their constituents or of a tenant representing other tenants in a housing dispute. <i>We cannot represent this knowledge to our formal reason.</i>
slayer	Someone who kills a person or animal in a violent way. <i>A dragon slayer.</i>
<u>sustainable</u>	Able to be maintained at a certain rate or level. <i>Sustainable economic growth.</i>
