- Time passed in a particular bodily form.
- (Christianity) the Christian doctrine of the union of God and man in the person of Jesus Christ.
- A person who embodies in the flesh a deity, spirit, or quality.
- (in Christian theology) the embodiment of God the Son in human flesh as Jesus Christ.
- The form taken by a person or thing during an incarnation.


