- *Motivate or encourage (someone) to do something; provide with an incentive.*

### Synonyms of "Incentivize" as a verb (21 Words)

<b>act as a fillip to</b>	Discharge one’s duties.
<b>act as a impetus to</b>	Perform on a stage or theater.
<b>act as a incentive to</b>	Behave in a certain manner; show a certain behavior; conduct or comport oneself.
<b>act as a spur to</b>	Be suitable for theatrical performance.
<b>act as a stimulus to</b>	Be engaged in an activity, often for no particular purpose other than pleasure.
<b>activate</b>	Make active or more active. <i>Activate an old file.</i>
<b>encourage</b>	Inspire with confidence; give hope or courage to. <i>His financial success <b>encouraged</b> him to look for a wife.</i>

<b>fire</b>	Set fire to. <i>The boss <b>fired</b> his secretary today.</i>
<b>fire with enthusiasm</b>	Go off or discharge.
<b><u>fuel</u></b>	Supply or power an industrial plant vehicle or machine with fuel. <i>The tanker <b>fueled</b> in Bahrain.</i>
<b><u>galvanize</u></b>	Stimulate (muscles) by administering a shock. <i>The urgency of his voice <b>galvanized</b> them into action.</i>
<b><u>kindle</u></b>	(of an emotion) be aroused. <i>A love of art was <b>kindled</b> in me.</i>
<b><u>motivate</u></b>	Cause (someone) to have interest in or enthusiasm for something. <i>He said he would <b>motivate</b> funds to upgrade the food stalls.</i>
<b>move</b>	Cause to move or shift into a new position or place both in a concrete and in an abstract sense. <i>She <b>moved</b> to the door.</i>
<b><u>nourish</u></b>	Provide with nourishment. <i>I was doing everything I could to <b>nourish</b> and protect the baby.</i>
<b>prompt</b>	Supply a forgotten word or line to (an actor) during the performance of a play. <i>The violence <b>prompted</b> a wave of refugees to flee the country.</i>
<b>spark</b>	Emit or produce sparks. <i>The ignition <b>sparks</b> as soon as the gas is turned on.</i>
<b>spur on</b>	Equip with spurs.
<b>trigger</b>	Release or pull the trigger on. <i>People ask how much I weigh but I won't talk about numbers because I know that <b>triggers</b> me.</i>
<b>whet</b>	Sharpen by rubbing as on a whetstone. <i>The selection of quotations may <b>whet</b> your curiosity to investigate the source material.</i>
