Synonyms of "Inception" as a noun (12 Words)

<u>constitution</u>	The constitution written at the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia in 1787 and subsequently ratified by the original thirteen states. <i>Pregnancy had weakened her constitution</i> .
establishment	A marriage. She became an establishment figure.
formation	The act of fabricating something in a particular shape. They sat in orderly ranks in a circular formation .
foundation	Education or instruction in the fundamentals of a field of knowledge. <i>Misleading accusations with no foundation.</i>
<u>founding</u>	Food and lodging provided in addition to money.
inauguration	The ceremonial induction into a position. The inauguration of the Modern Art Museum.



<u>initiation</u>	The action of admitting someone into a secret or obscure society or group, typically with a ritual. <i>An initiation ceremony.</i>
institution	A custom that for a long time has been an important feature of some group or society. <i>The institutions of democratic government.</i>
opening	The act of opening something. An opening in the roof would get rid of the smoke.
<u>origin</u>	A fixed point from which coordinates are measured. <i>The name is Norse in origin.</i>
<u>origination</u>	The act of starting something for the first time; introducing something new. Mortgage loan origination s were up 15 per cent.
setting up	The state of the environment in which a situation exists.






Usage Examples of "Inception" as a noun

Associations of "Inception" (30 Words)

archetype

(in Jungian theory) a primitive mental image inherited from the earliest human ancestors, and supposed to be present in the collective unconscious. *He was the archetype of the old style football club chairman.*



beginning	Serving to begin. She had the beginning s of a headache.
<u>commence</u>	Take the first step or steps in carrying out an action. <i>His design team commenced work.</i>
<u>commencement</u>	The act of starting something. The date of commencement .
disinclination	A reluctance or lack of enthusiasm. His disinclination for modesty is well known.
<u>early</u>	During an early stage. Look for an early end to the negotiations.
<u>emanate</u>	Originate from; be produced by. <i>He emanated a powerful brooding air.</i>
first	The first element in a countable series. <i>Played first horn.</i>
germinal	Seventh month of the Revolutionary calendar (March and April); the month of buds. A germinal idea.
<u>groundbreaking</u>	Being or producing something like nothing done or experienced or created before. <i>Groundbreaking</i> research into fertility problems.
hesitancy	A feeling of diffidence and indecision about doing something. Jackson took advantage of some hesitancy in the defence to rifle in a shot.
<u>imaginative</u>	(used of persons or artifacts) marked by independence and creativity in thought or action. Making imaginative use of computer software.
inchoate	Confused or incoherent. A vague inchoate idea.
inchoative	An inchoative verb. <i>Inchoative</i> stages.
<u>incipient</u>	Beginning to happen or develop. An incipient tumor.
initial	Mark or sign a document with one s initials in order to authorize or validate it. Greece and the United States initial led a new defence cooperation agreement.
initially	At first. Initially he thought the new concept was nonsense.



<u>origin</u>	The place where something begins, where it springs into being. A voice that betrays his Welsh origin s.
<u>original</u>	An original creation i e an audio recording from which copies can be made. An original mind.
<u>originally</u>	From or in the beginning; at first. The suggestions so originally and persuasively outlined.
<u>originate</u>	Have a specified beginning. A new religious movement originate d in that country.
outset	The time at which something is supposed to begin. The project was flawed from the outset .
<u>phase</u>	Each of the electrical windings or connections of a polyphase machine or circuit. <i>The final phases of the war.</i>
<u>pioneer</u>	Open up a road or terrain as a pioneer. A famous pioneer of birth control.
precursory	Warning of future misfortune. Precursory seismic activity.
provenance	Where something originated or was nurtured in its early existence. An orange rug of Iranian provenance .
source	Obtain from a particular source. The source of the Nile.
start	A line indicating the location of the start of a race or a game. The event was a shambles from start to finish.
trailblazer	Someone who marks a trail by leaving blazes on trees. He was a trailblazer for many ideas that are now standard fare.
unabridged	Not shortened. An unabridged novel.
