Definitions of "Incidents" as an adjective

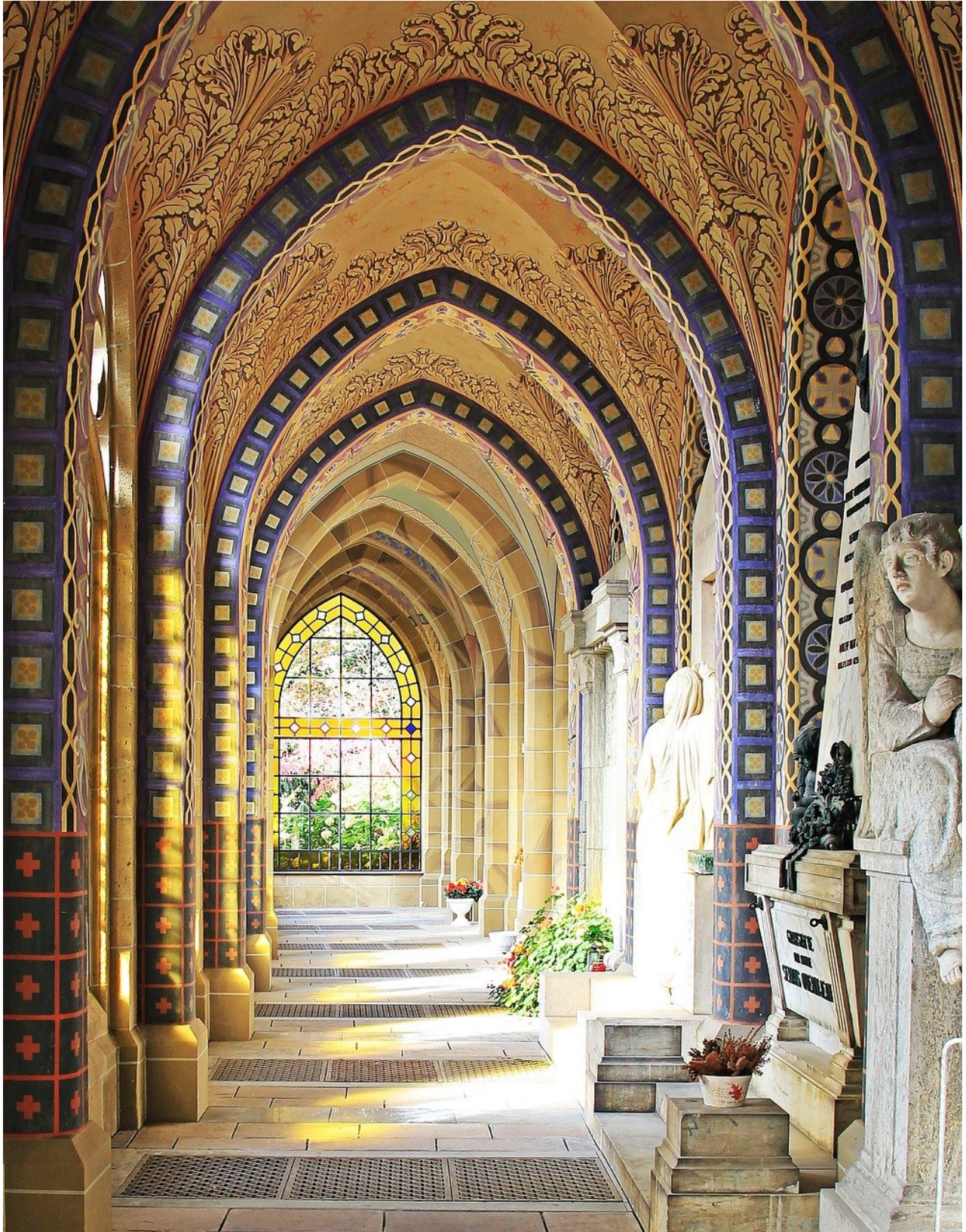
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “incidents” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(sometimes followed by `to')* minor or casual or subordinate in significance or nature or occurring as a chance concomitant or consequence.
- *Falling or striking of light rays on something.*
- *Minor or casual or subordinate in significance or nature or occurring as a chance concomitant or consequence.*



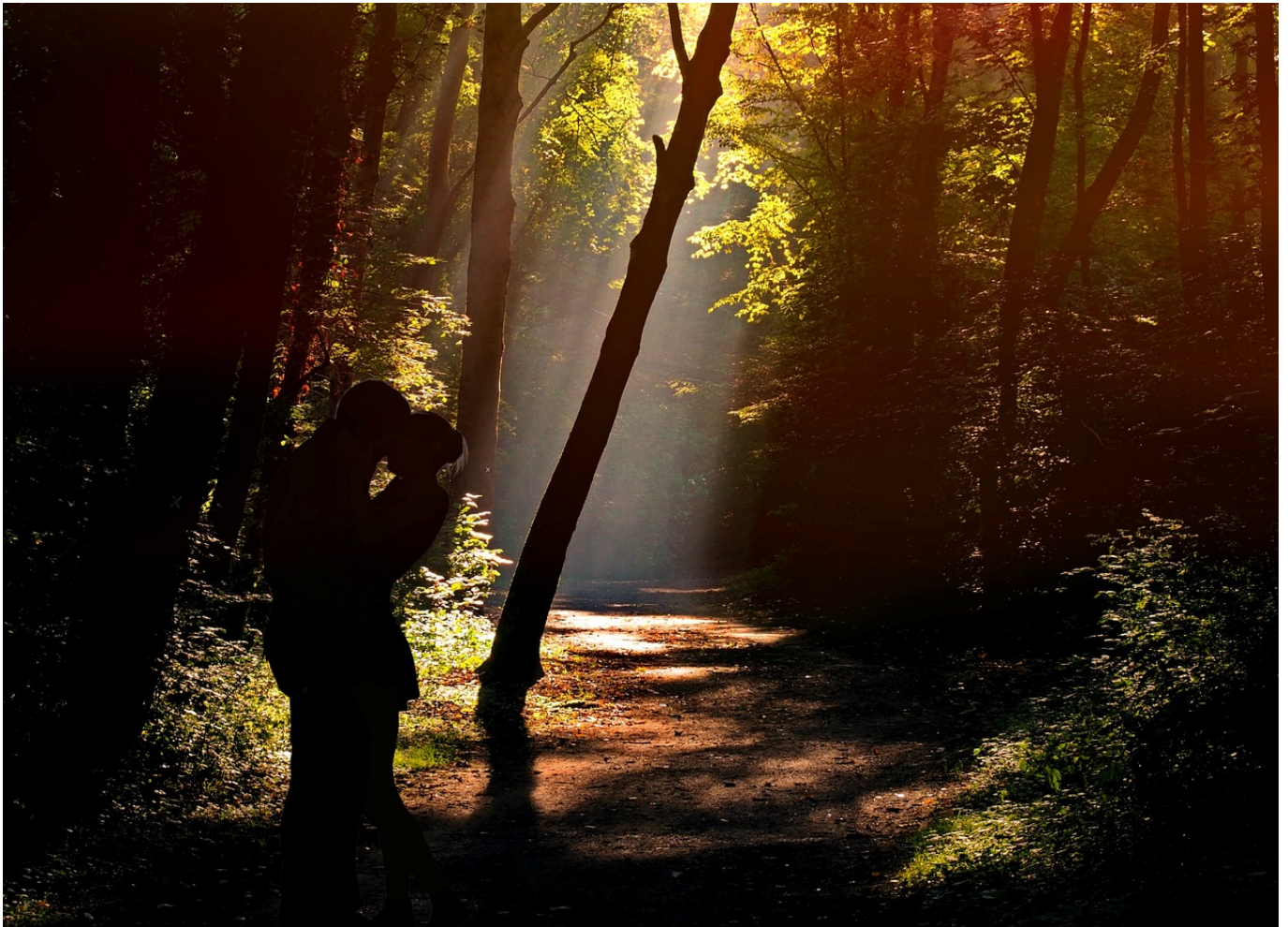
Synonyms of "Incidents" as an adjective (1 Word)

incidental Not of prime or central importance.
*Labor problems **incidental** to a rapid expansion.*

- *Confusion incidental to a quick change.*
- *Incidental expenses.*
- *Labor problems incidental to a rapid expansion.*



Associations of "Incidents" (30 Words)

accident

Anything that happens suddenly or by chance without an apparent cause.

*Winning the lottery was a happy **accident**.*

accidental	A sign indicating a momentary departure from the key signature by raising or lowering a note. <i>The location is accidental and contributes nothing to the poem.</i>
accidentally	Of a minor or subordinate nature. <i>They met accidentally.</i>
activate	Make active or more active. <i>Activate a metal.</i>
actually	Used to introduce a new topic or to add information to a previous statement. <i>No one actually saw the shark.</i>
case	A set of facts or arguments supporting one side in a legal case. <i>A typical case was the suburban housewife described by a marriage counselor.</i>
<u>coincidence</u>	A remarkable concurrence of events or circumstances without apparent causal connection. <i>He waited for the coincidence of the target and the cross hairs.</i>
<u>contemporaneous</u>	Of the same period. <i>Pythagoras was contemporaneous with Buddha.</i>
<u>episode</u>	Each of the separate instalments into which a serialized story or radio or television programme is divided. <i>The whole episode has been a major embarrassment.</i>
event	A thing that happens or takes place, especially one of importance. <i>Staff have been holding a number of events to raise money for charity.</i>
exist	Have an existence be extant. <i>Dossiers existed on almost everyone of prominence.</i>
hap	An accidental happening. <i>He recorded all the little haps and mishaps of his life.</i>
happen	Happen occur or be the case in the course of events or by chance Santayana. <i>The afternoon when the disturbance happened.</i>
happening	An event or occurrence. <i>Altogether it was an eerie happening.</i>
<u>inadvertently</u>	Without knowledge or intention. <i>His name had been inadvertently omitted from the list.</i>
<u>incidence</u>	The relative frequency of occurrence of something. <i>The point of incidence of the beam.</i>
incidental	An item that is incidental. <i>Labor problems incidental to a rapid expansion.</i>

materialize	Come into being; become reality. <i>The train failed to materialize.</i>
occasion	Give occasion to. <i>Sunday lunch has a suitable sense of occasion about it.</i>
occur	Come to one's mind; suggest itself. <i>Nothing occurred that seemed important.</i>
<u>occurrence</u>	An event that happens. <i>The occurrence of natural gas fields.</i>
pentathlon	An athletic event comprising five different events for each competitor in particular also modern pentathlon an event involving fencing shooting swimming riding and cross country running.
<u>phenomenon</u>	A remarkable development. <i>The band was a pop phenomenon just for their sales figures alone.</i>
recur	Happen or occur again. <i>This is a recurring story.</i>
<u>recurring</u>	(of a thought, image, or memory) repeatedly coming back to a person's mind. <i>They are haunted by a recurring image of their daughter on the night she died.</i>
<u>traumatic</u>	Psychologically painful. <i>She was going through a traumatic divorce.</i>
<u>unexpected</u>	Not expected or regarded as likely to happen. <i>His death was totally unexpected.</i>
<u>unforeseen</u>	Not anticipated- H.W.Glidden. <i>Unforeseen circumstances.</i>
<u>unintentionally</u>	Not on purpose. <i>Unintentionally rude song lyrics.</i>
upcoming	About to happen; forthcoming. <i>The upcoming election.</i>
