### **Definitions of "Incidents" as an adjective**

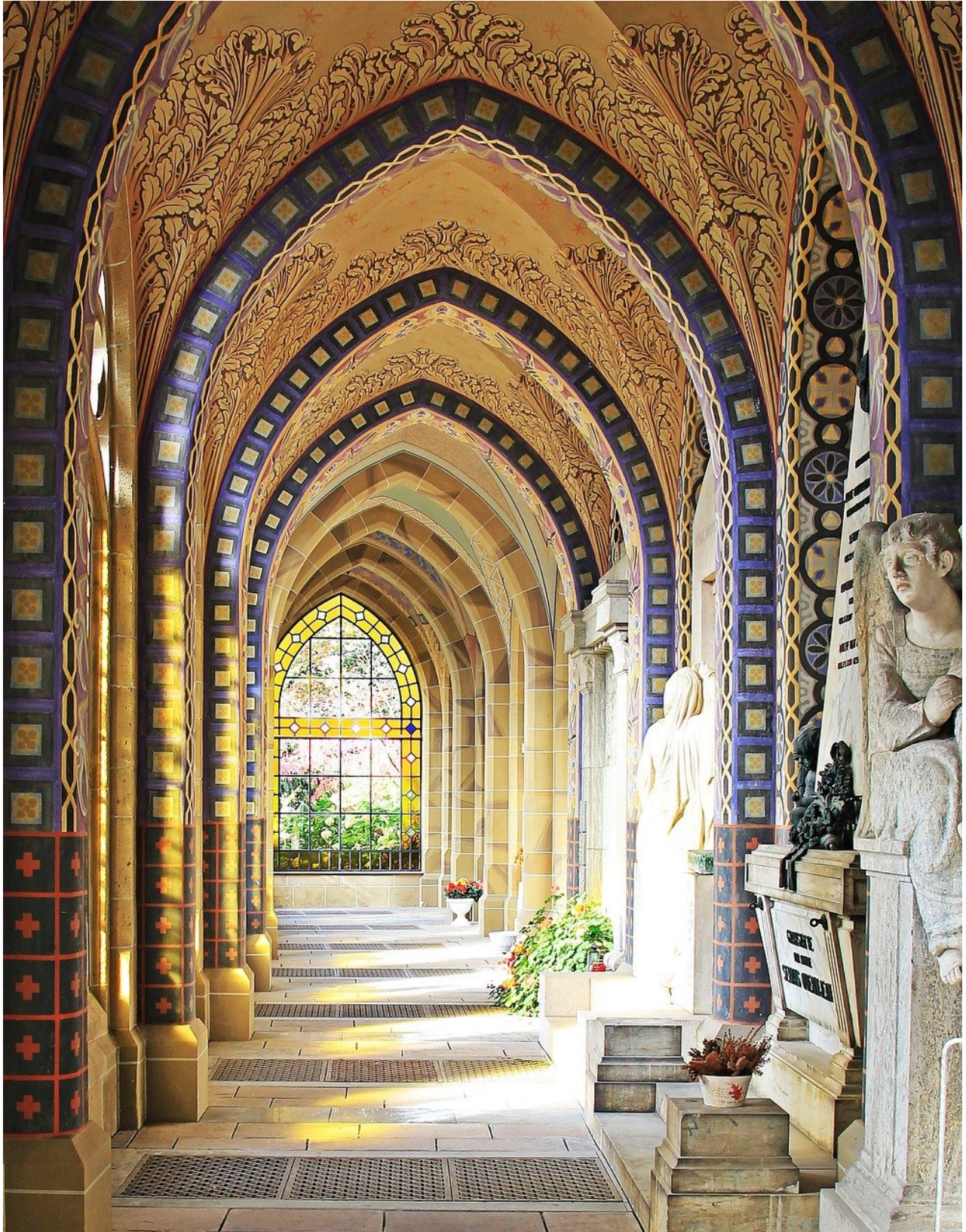
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “incidents” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(sometimes followed by `to')* minor or casual or subordinate in significance or nature or occurring as a chance concomitant or consequence.
- *Falling or striking of light rays on something.*
- *Minor or casual or subordinate in significance or nature or occurring as a chance concomitant or consequence.*



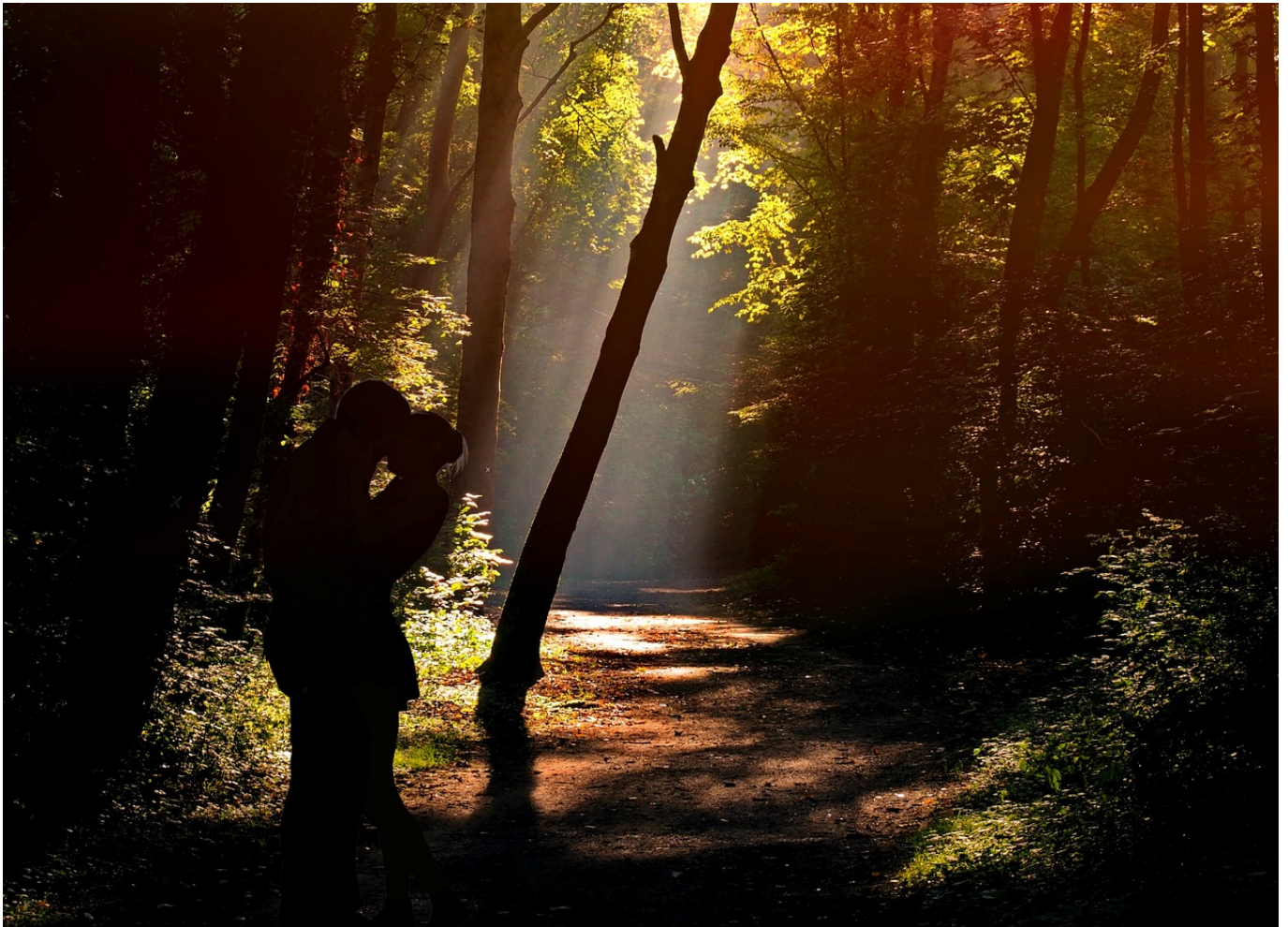
## Synonyms of "Incidents" as an adjective (1 Word)

## Associations of "Incidents" (30 Words)

### [accident](#)

Anything that happens suddenly or by chance without an apparent cause.

*Winning the lottery was a happy **accident**.*

<b>accidental</b>	A sign indicating a momentary departure from the key signature by raising or lowering a note. <i>The location is <b>accidental</b> and contributes nothing to the poem.</i>
<b>accidentally</b>	Of a minor or subordinate nature. <i>They met <b>accidentally</b>.</i>
<b>activate</b>	Make active or more active. <i><b>Activate</b> a metal.</i>
<b>actually</b>	Used to introduce a new topic or to add information to a previous statement. <i>No one <b>actually</b> saw the shark.</i>
<b>case</b>	A set of facts or arguments supporting one side in a legal case. <i>A typical <b>case</b> was the suburban housewife described by a marriage counselor.</i>
<b><u>coincidence</u></b>	A remarkable concurrence of events or circumstances without apparent causal connection. <i>He waited for the <b>coincidence</b> of the target and the cross hairs.</i>
<b><u>contemporaneous</u></b>	Of the same period. <i>Pythagoras was <b>contemporaneous</b> with Buddha.</i>
<b><u>episode</u></b>	Each of the separate instalments into which a serialized story or radio or television programme is divided. <i>The whole <b>episode</b> has been a major embarrassment.</i>
<b>event</b>	A thing that happens or takes place, especially one of importance. <i>Staff have been holding a number of <b>events</b> to raise money for charity.</i>
<b>exist</b>	Have an existence be extant. <i>Dossiers <b>existed</b> on almost everyone of prominence.</i>
<b>hap</b>	An accidental happening. <i>He recorded all the little <b>haps</b> and <b>mishaps</b> of his life.</i>
<b>happen</b>	Happen occur or be the case in the course of events or by chance Santayana. <i>The afternoon when the disturbance <b>happened</b>.</i>
<b>happening</b>	An event or occurrence. <i>Altogether it was an eerie <b>happening</b>.</i>
<b><u>inadvertently</u></b>	Without knowledge or intention. <i>His name had been <b>inadvertently</b> omitted from the list.</i>
<b><u>incidence</u></b>	The relative frequency of occurrence of something. <i>The point of <b>incidence</b> of the beam.</i>
<b>incidental</b>	An item that is incidental. <i>Labor problems <b>incidental</b> to a rapid expansion.</i>

<b>materialize</b>	Come into being; become reality. <i>The train failed to <b>materialize</b>.</i>
<b>occasion</b>	Give occasion to. <i>Sunday lunch has a suitable sense of <b>occasion</b> about it.</i>
<b>occur</b>	Come to one's mind; suggest itself. <i>Nothing <b>occurred</b> that seemed important.</i>
<u><b>occurrence</b></u>	An event that happens. <i>The <b>occurrence</b> of natural gas fields.</i>
<b>pentathlon</b>	An athletic event comprising five different events for each competitor in particular also modern pentathlon an event involving fencing shooting swimming riding and cross country running.
<u><b>phenomenon</b></u>	A remarkable development. <i>The band was a pop <b>phenomenon</b> just for their sales figures alone.</i>
<b>recur</b>	Happen or occur again. <i>This is a <b>recurring</b> story.</i>
<u><b>recurring</b></u>	(of a thought, image, or memory) repeatedly coming back to a person's mind. <i>They are haunted by a <b>recurring</b> image of their daughter on the night she died.</i>
<u><b>traumatic</b></u>	Psychologically painful. <i>She was going through a <b>traumatic</b> divorce.</i>
<u><b>unexpected</b></u>	Not expected or regarded as likely to happen. <i>His death was totally <b>unexpected</b>.</i>
<u><b>unforeseen</b></u>	Not anticipated- H.W.Glidden. <i><b>Unforeseen</b> circumstances.</i>
<u><b>unintentionally</b></u>	Not on purpose. <i><b>Unintentionally</b> rude song lyrics.</i>
<b>upcoming</b>	About to happen; forthcoming. <i>The <b>upcoming</b> election.</i>
