Definitions of "Incoherent" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “incoherent” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Without logical or meaningful connection.*
- *(of waves) having no definite or stable phase relationship.*
- *Not logical or internally consistent.*
- *Of waves having no stable definite or stable phase relation.*
- *(of a person) unable to speak intelligibly.*
- *(of spoken or written language) expressed in an incomprehensible or confusing way; unclear.*
- *Unable to express yourself clearly or fluently.*

Synonyms of "Incoherent" as an adjective (20 Words)

babbling (of flowing water) making a continuous murmuring sound.
*The noise of **babbling** tourists.*

confused	Having lost your bearings confused as to time or place or personal identity. <i>The confused information supplied by authorities.</i>
<u>delirious</u>	Marked by uncontrolled excitement or emotion. <i>There was a great roar from the delirious crowd.</i>
disconnected	Music marked by or composed of disconnected parts or sounds cut short crisply. <i>I drove away feeling disconnected from the real world.</i>
<u>disjointed</u>	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>A disjointed fowl.</i>
disordered	Not arranged in order. <i>The small disordered room.</i>
garbled	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>I got a garbled set of directions.</i>
hard to follow	Produced without vibration of the vocal cords.
<u>hysterical</u>	Extremely funny. <i>Janet became hysterical and began screaming.</i>
incomprehensible	Not able to be understood; not intelligible. <i>The most incomprehensible thing about the universe is that it is comprehensible.</i>
<u>irrational</u>	Of a number quantity or expression not expressible as a ratio of two integers and having an infinite and non recurring expansion when expressed as a decimal Examples of irrational numbers are the number and the square root of 2. <i>Irrational numbers.</i>
jumbled	In utter disorder.
mixed up	Involving or composed of different races.
muddled	Confused and vague; used especially of thinking. <i>Such a view reflects muddled thinking.</i>
raving	Used to emphasize a particular quality. <i>Have you gone raving mad.</i>
scrambled	Thrown together in a disorderly fashion. <i>A scrambled plan of action.</i>
tongue-tied	Unable to express yourself clearly or fluently.
<u>unclear</u>	Not easily deciphered. <i>Their future remains unclear.</i>

unconnected	Not joined or linked together. <i>The question was unconnected to anything they had been discussing.</i>
unintelligible	Not clearly understood or expressed. <i>Dolphin sounds are unintelligible to humans.</i>

absurd	An absurd state of affairs. <i>The incidents that followed bordered on the absurd.</i>
addle	(of an egg) become rotten, producing no chick. <i>Being in love must have addled your brain.</i>
<u>amorphous</u>	(of a group of people or an organization) unorganized or unfocused. <i>An amorphous characterless conurbation.</i>
babble	Reveal something secret or confidential by talking carelessly. <i>The answers were difficult to hear amid the babble of conversation.</i>
babbling	Talking rapidly and continuously in a foolish, excited, or incomprehensible way. <i>The constant babbling of the kids.</i>
confused	Mentally confused unable to think with clarity or act intelligently. <i>Interviewing confused old people does take longer.</i>
<u>disjointed</u>	Separated at the joint. <i>A disjointed fowl.</i>
disordered	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>A patient who is mentally disordered.</i>
<u>disorganized</u>	Unable to plan one's activities efficiently. <i>A disorganized enterprise.</i>
distributed	(of a term) used to include every individual of the class to which it refers. <i>The figures of syllogisms all have properly distributed middle terms.</i>

garbled	(of a message, sound, or transmission) confused and distorted; unclear. <i>I got a garbled set of directions.</i>
gibber	Speak rapidly and unintelligibly, typically through fear or shock. <i>They shrieked and gibbered as flames surrounded them.</i>
gibberish	Unintelligible talking. <i>He talks gibberish.</i>
illogical	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>An illogical fear of the supernatural.</i>
<u>irrational</u>	An irrational number or quantity a surd. <i>Irrational fears.</i>
jumble	Be all mixed up or jumbled together. <i>She jumbles the words when she is supposed to write a sentence.</i>
maunder	Speak (about unimportant matters) rapidly and incessantly. <i>He maunders through the bank composing his thoughts.</i>
muddle	Confuse (a person or their thoughts). <i>She was able to cut through confusion and muddle.</i>
<u>mumble</u>	Bite or chew (something) with toothless gums or without making much use of the teeth. <i>She mumbled a piece of black bread.</i>
<u>murmur</u>	The quiet or subdued expression of a particular feeling by a group of people. <i>The wind was murmuring through the trees.</i>
<u>nonsense</u>	Something ridiculously impractical or ill-advised. <i>She s a strong woman who stands no nonsense.</i>
<u>opaque</u>	An opaque thing. <i>Opaque to X rays.</i>
palaver	An improvised conference between two groups, typically those without a shared language or culture. <i>Getting into each building was a bit of a palaver.</i>
prattle	Idle or foolish and irrelevant talk. <i>Do you intend to keep up this childish prattle.</i>
scattered	(of a person) distracted or disorganized. <i>A scattered clifftop community.</i>
separated	Separated at the joint. <i>Thought of herself as alone and separated from the others.</i>
<u>superstitious</u>	Having or showing a belief in superstitions. <i>Finally realized that the horror he felt was superstitious in origin.</i>

unintelligible Poorly articulated or enunciated, or drowned by noise.
*Dolphin sounds are **unintelligible** to humans.*

unreasonable Beyond the limits of acceptability or fairness.
*An **unreasonable** request.*

untenable (especially of a position or view) not able to be maintained or defended against attack or objection.
*This argument is clearly **untenable**.*
