### Definitions of "Incoherent" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “incoherent” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Without logical or meaningful connection.*
- *(of waves) having no definite or stable phase relationship.*
- *Not logical or internally consistent.*
- *Of waves having no stable definite or stable phase relation.*
- *(of a person) unable to speak intelligibly.*
- *(of spoken or written language) expressed in an incomprehensible or confusing way; unclear.*
- *Unable to express yourself clearly or fluently.*

### Synonyms of "Incoherent" as an adjective (20 Words)

**babbling** (of flowing water) making a continuous murmuring sound.  
*The noise of **babbling** tourists.*

<b>confused</b>	Having lost your bearings confused as to time or place or personal identity. <i>The <b>confused</b> information supplied by authorities.</i>
<b><u>delirious</u></b>	Marked by uncontrolled excitement or emotion. <i>There was a great roar from the <b>delirious</b> crowd.</i>
<b>disconnected</b>	Music marked by or composed of disconnected parts or sounds cut short crisply. <i>I drove away feeling <b>disconnected</b> from the real world.</i>
<b><u>disjointed</u></b>	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>A <b>disjointed</b> fowl.</i>
<b>disordered</b>	Not arranged in order. <i>The small <b>disordered</b> room.</i>
<b>garbled</b>	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>I got a <b>garbled</b> set of directions.</i>
<b>hard to follow</b>	Produced without vibration of the vocal cords.
<b><u>hysterical</u></b>	Extremely funny. <i>Janet became <b>hysterical</b> and began screaming.</i>
<b>incomprehensible</b>	Not able to be understood; not intelligible. <i>The most <b>incomprehensible</b> thing about the universe is that it is comprehensible.</i>
<b><u>irrational</u></b>	Of a number quantity or expression not expressible as a ratio of two integers and having an infinite and non recurring expansion when expressed as a decimal Examples of irrational numbers are the number and the square root of 2. <i><b>Irrational</b> numbers.</i>
<b>jumbled</b>	In utter disorder.
<b>mixed up</b>	Involving or composed of different races.
<b>muddled</b>	Confused and vague; used especially of thinking. <i>Such a view reflects <b>muddled</b> thinking.</i>
<b>raving</b>	Used to emphasize a particular quality. <i>Have you gone <b>raving</b> mad.</i>
<b>scrambled</b>	Thrown together in a disorderly fashion. <i>A <b>scrambled</b> plan of action.</i>
<b>tongue-tied</b>	Unable to express yourself clearly or fluently.
<b><u>unclear</u></b>	Not easily deciphered. <i>Their future remains <b>unclear</b>.</i>

<b>unconnected</b>	Not joined or linked together. <i>The question was <b>unconnected</b> to anything they had been discussing.</i>
<b>unintelligible</b>	Not clearly understood or expressed. <i>Dolphin sounds are <b>unintelligible</b> to humans.</i>

<b>absurd</b>	An absurd state of affairs. <i>The incidents that followed bordered on the <b>absurd</b>.</i>
<b>addle</b>	(of an egg) become rotten, producing no chick. <i>Being in love must have <b>addled</b> your brain.</i>
<b><u>amorphous</u></b>	(of a group of people or an organization) unorganized or unfocused. <i>An <b>amorphous</b> characterless conurbation.</i>
<b>babble</b>	Reveal something secret or confidential by talking carelessly. <i>The answers were difficult to hear amid the <b>babble</b> of conversation.</i>
<b>babbling</b>	Talking rapidly and continuously in a foolish, excited, or incomprehensible way. <i>The constant <b>babbling</b> of the kids.</i>
<b>confused</b>	Mentally confused unable to think with clarity or act intelligently. <i>Interviewing <b>confused</b> old people does take longer.</i>
<b><u>disjointed</u></b>	Separated at the joint. <i>A <b>disjointed</b> fowl.</i>
<b>disordered</b>	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>A patient who is mentally <b>disordered</b>.</i>
<b><u>disorganized</u></b>	Unable to plan one's activities efficiently. <i>A <b>disorganized</b> enterprise.</i>
<b>distributed</b>	(of a term) used to include every individual of the class to which it refers. <i>The figures of syllogisms all have properly <b>distributed</b> middle terms.</i>

<b>garbled</b>	(of a message, sound, or transmission) confused and distorted; unclear. <i>I got a <b>garbled</b> set of directions.</i>
<b>gibber</b>	Speak rapidly and unintelligibly, typically through fear or shock. <i>They shrieked and <b>gibbered</b> as flames surrounded them.</i>
<b>gibberish</b>	Unintelligible talking. <i>He talks <b>gibberish</b>.</i>
<b>illogical</b>	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>An <b>illogical</b> fear of the supernatural.</i>
<b>irrational</b>	An irrational number or quantity a surd. <i><b>Irrational</b> fears.</i>
<b>jumble</b>	Be all mixed up or jumbled together. <i>She <b>jumbles</b> the words when she is supposed to write a sentence.</i>
<b>maunder</b>	Speak (about unimportant matters) rapidly and incessantly. <i>He <b>maunders</b> through the bank composing his thoughts.</i>
<b>muddle</b>	Confuse (a person or their thoughts). <i>She was able to cut through confusion and <b>muddle</b>.</i>
<b>mumble</b>	Bite or chew (something) with toothless gums or without making much use of the teeth. <i>She <b>mumbled</b> a piece of black bread.</i>
<b>murmur</b>	The quiet or subdued expression of a particular feeling by a group of people. <i>The wind was <b>murmuring</b> through the trees.</i>
<b>nonsense</b>	Something ridiculously impractical or ill-advised. <i>She s a strong woman who stands no <b>nonsense</b>.</i>
<b>opaque</b>	An opaque thing. <i><b>Opaque</b> to X rays.</i>
<b>palaver</b>	An improvised conference between two groups, typically those without a shared language or culture. <i>Getting into each building was a bit of a <b>palaver</b>.</i>
<b>prattle</b>	Idle or foolish and irrelevant talk. <i>Do you intend to keep up this childish <b>prattle</b>.</i>
<b>scattered</b>	(of a person) distracted or disorganized. <i>A <b>scattered</b> clifftop community.</i>
<b>separated</b>	Separated at the joint. <i>Thought of herself as alone and <b>separated</b> from the others.</i>
<b>superstitious</b>	Having or showing a belief in superstitions. <i>Finally realized that the horror he felt was <b>superstitious</b> in origin.</i>

**unintelligible** Poorly articulated or enunciated, or drowned by noise.  
*Dolphin sounds are **unintelligible** to humans.*

**unreasonable** Beyond the limits of acceptability or fairness.  
*An **unreasonable** request.*

**untenable** (especially of a position or view) not able to be maintained or defended against attack or objection.  
*This argument is clearly **untenable**.*
