According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "incoherent" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Without logical or meaningful connection.
- (of waves) having no definite or stable phase relationship.
- *Not logical or internally consistent.*
- Of waves having no stable definite or stable phase relation.
- (of a person) unable to speak intelligibly.
- (of spoken or written language) expressed in an incomprehensible or confusing way; unclear.
- Unable to express yourself clearly or fluently.

Janet became **hysterical** and began screaming.

Not able to be understood; not intelligible.

incomprehensible The most **incomprehensible** thing about the universe is that it is

comprehensible.

Of a number quantity or expression not expressible as a ratio of two integers and having an infinite and non recurring expansion when

irrational expressed as a decimal Examples of irrational numbers are the number

jumbled In utter disorder.

mixed up Involving or composed of different races.

muddled Confused and vague; used especially of thinking.

Such a view reflects **muddled** thinking.

raving Used to emphasize a particular quality.

Have you gone **raving** mad.

scrambled Thrown together in a disorderly fashion.

A **scrambled** plan of action.

tongue-tied Unable to express yourself clearly or fluently.

Not easily deciphered.

unclear Their future remains unclear.



unconnected Not joined or linked together.

The question was **unconnected** to anything they had been discussing.

unintelligible Not clearly understood or expressed.

Dolphin sounds are **unintelligible** to humans.

Usage Examples of "Incoherent" as an adjective

disorganized A disorganized enterprise.

distributed (of a term) used to include every individual of the class to which it refers.

The figures of syllogisms all have properly **distributed** middle terms.



garbled (of a message, sound, or transmission) confused and distorted; unclear.

I got a **garbled** set of directions.

Speak rapidly and unintelligibly, typically through fear or shock.

They shrieked and **gibber**ed as flames surrounded them.

gibberish Unintelligible talking. He talks gibberish.

illogical Lacking orderly continuity.

An **illogical** fear of the supernatural.

An irrational number or quantity a surd.

Irrational *Irrational fears.*

jumble Be all mixed up or jumbled together.

She **jumble**s the words when she is supposed to write a sentence.

maunder Speak (about unimportant matters) rapidly and incessantly.

He **maunder**s through the bank composing his thoughts.

muddle Confuse (a person or their thoughts.

She was able to cut through confusion and **muddle**.

Bite or chew (something) with toothless gums or without making much use

mumble of the teeth.

She **mumble**d a piece of black bread.

The guiet or subdued expression of a particular feeling by a group of

murmur people.

The wind was **murmur**ing through the trees.

nonsense Something ridiculously impractical or ill-advised.

She s a strong woman who stands no **nonsense**.

An opaque thing.

Opaque to X rays.

An improvised conference between two groups, typically those without a

palaver shared language or culture.

Getting into each building was a bit of a **palaver**.

prattle Idle or foolish and irrelevant talk.

Do you intend to keep up this childish **prattle**.

(of a person) distracted or disorganized.

scattered A scattered clifftop community.

Separated at the joint.

separated Separated at the joint.

Thought of herself as alone and **separated** from the others.

Having or showing a belief in superstitions.

Finally realized that the horror he felt was **superstitious** in origin.
