- *Not yet finished.*

| fragmentary | Consisting of small disconnected or incomplete parts. <i>Excavations have revealed fragmentary remains of masonry.</i> |
| fragmented | Having been divided; having the unity destroyed. <i>A fragmented coalition.</i> |
| <u>imperfect</u> | (of a gift, title, etc.) transferred without all the necessary conditions or requirements being met. <i>Drainage here is imperfect.</i> |
| <u>insufficient</u> | Of a quantity not able to fulfill a need or requirement. <i>There was insufficient evidence to convict him.</i> |

| not completed | Completed by the first act of sexual intercourse after the ceremony. |
| not concluded | Having come or been brought to a conclusion. |
| not finished | Having a surface coating or finish applied. |
| partial | Having a strong preference or liking for. <i>Partial immunity.</i> |
| patchy | Not of the same quality throughout; inconsistent. <i>Patchy fog.</i> |
| scrappy | Determined, argumentative, or pugnacious. <i>Scrappy lecture notes piled up unread.</i> |
| sketchy | Giving only major points; lacking completeness. <i>A sketchy neighbourhood.</i> |
| uncomplete | Not complete or total; not completed. |
| uncompleted | Not completed. <i>Five uncompleted nuclear power stations.</i> |
| unfinished | Lacking a surface finish such as paint. <i>Her last novel is unfinished.</i> |

| alliterate | (of a phrase or line of verse) contain words which begin with the same sound or letter. <i>His first and last names alliterated.</i> |
| alliteration | The occurrence of the same letter or sound at the beginning of adjacent or closely connected words. <i>Alliterations are clustered in the last few lines.</i> |
| approximate | Not quite exact or correct. <i>Her results approximate my own.</i> |
| biased | Favoring one person or side over another. <i>We will not tolerate this biased media coverage.</i> |
| dicey | Unpredictable and potentially dangerous. <i>Democracy is a dicey business.</i> |
| dozen | The cardinal number that is the sum of eleven and one. <i>She has dozens of admirers.</i> |
| equidistant | At equal distances. <i>The line joins together all points which are equidistant from the two axes.</i> |
| few | A small elite group. <i>Few roses were still blooming.</i> |
| fractional | Small or tiny in amount. <i>There was a fractional hesitation before he said yes.</i> |
| fragmentary | Consisting of small disconnected parts. <i>Fragmentary remains.</i> |
| half | Partially or to the extent of a half. <i>A half of bitter.</i> |
| least | Used in names of very small animals and plants e.g. least shrew. <i>He has the least talent of anyone.</i> |
| moiety | One of two basic subdivisions of a tribe. <i>The enzyme removes the sulphate moiety.</i> |
| nearly | In a close manner. <i>David was nearly asleep.</i> |
| part | The appropriate or expected behaviour in a particular role or situation one's duty. <i>She played a lot of leading parts.</i> |
| partial | A component of a musical sound; an overtone or harmonic. <i>Partial to horror movies.</i> |

| partially | Only in part; to a limited extent. <i>A partially open door.</i> |
| pendent | Hanging down or overhanging. <i>The use of jurisdiction to decide pendent claims.</i> |
| portion | Serve (food) in an amount suitable for one person. <i>His portion was larger than hers.</i> |
| proximate | Nearly accurate approximate. <i>Proximate houses.</i> |
| quarter | Divide by four divide into quarters. <i>Peel and quarter the bananas.</i> |
| rough | With rough motion as over a rough surface. <i>Rough manners.</i> |
| section | Commit someone compulsorily to a psychiatric hospital in accordance with a section of a mental health act. <i>A residential section of the capital.</i> |
| sector | The minimum track length that can be assigned to store information unless otherwise specified a sector of data consists of 512 bytes. <i>Operations in the southern sector of the North Sea.</i> |
| semi | A semi trailer. <i>She pulled into the path of a semi.</i> |
| sketchy | Not thorough or detailed. <i>The information they had was sketchy.</i> |
| some | To some extent quite a lot. <i>We did not meet again for some years.</i> |
| twelve | Denoting a quantity consisting of 12 items or units. |
| unfinished | Lacking a surface finish such as paint. <i>The building is still unfinished.</i> |
| uninformative | Not providing particularly useful or interesting information. <i>The coverage is brief and uninformative.</i> |
