- *Not capable of being imagined or grasped mentally; unbelievable.*
- *Totally unlikely.*

### Synonyms of "Inconceivable" as an adjective (8 Words)

<b><a href="#">impossible</a></b>	Not able to occur, exist, or be done. <i>An <b>impossible</b> dream.</i>
<b>incredible</b>	Very good; wonderful. <i>At <b>incredible</b> speed.</i>
<b>not in the least likely</b>	Holding office.
<b>out of the question</b>	Knocked unconscious by a heavy blow.
<b><a href="#">unbelievable</a></b>	Not able to be believed; unlikely to be true. <i><b>Unbelievable</b> or not it happened.</i>
<b>unimaginable</b>	Difficult or impossible to imagine or comprehend. <i>Lives of almost <b>unimaginable</b> deprivation.</i>

<b>unimagined</b>	Not having been imagined or thought of as possible. <i>A previously <b>unimagined</b> degree of economic and social freedom.</i>
<b><u>unthinkable</u></b>	Incapable of being conceived or considered. <i>The <b>unthinkable</b> happened I spoke up.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Inconceivable" as an adjective

- *They behaved with inconceivable cruelty.*
- *It seemed inconceivable that the president had been unaware of what was going on.*

## Associations of "Inconceivable" (30 Words)

<b><u>amaze</u></b>	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>She <b>amazed</b> doctors by fighting back when her deteriorating condition caused her to suffer heart failure.</i>
<b>amazing</b>	Inspiring awe or admiration or wonder. <i>An <b>amazing</b> number of people registered.</i>
<b>astonish</b>	Surprise or impress (someone) greatly. <i>It <b>astonished</b> her that he was so anxious.</i>
<b><u>astonishing</u></b>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>An <b>astonishing</b> achievement.</i>
<b>astound</b>	Shock or greatly surprise. <i>Her bluntness <b>astounded</b> him.</i>
<b><u>astounding</u></b>	Surprisingly impressive or notable. <i>The summit offers <b>astounding</b> views.</i>
<b>difficult</b>	Characterized by or causing hardships or problems. <i>Lily could be <b>difficult</b>.</i>
<b>implausible</b>	Having a quality that provokes disbelief. <i>Gave the teacher an <b>implausible</b> excuse.</i>
<b><u>impossible</u></b>	Not capable of occurring or being accomplished or dealt with. <i>What an arrogant <b>impossible</b> fool.</i>
<b>impracticable</b>	(of a course of action) impossible in practice to do or carry out. <i>Refloating the sunken ship proved <b>impracticable</b> because of its fragility.</i>
<b>improbable</b>	Too improbable to admit of belief. <i>The characters have <b>improbable</b> names.</i>
<b>incredible</b>	Very good; wonderful. <i>An almost <b>incredible</b> tale of triumph and tragedy.</i>

<b>incredibly</b>	Used to introduce a statement that is hard to believe; strangely. <i><b>Incredibly</b> she survived the crash.</i>
<b>levity</b>	Feeling an inappropriate lack of seriousness. <i>As an attempt to introduce a note of <b>levity</b> the words were a disastrous flop.</i>
<b>marvelous</b>	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>A <b>marvelous</b> collection of rare books.</i>
<b>miraculously</b>	In a miraculous manner. <i>The two drivers <b>miraculously</b> escaped with only minor injuries.</i>
<b>practically</b>	For all practical purposes but not completely. <i>The place was <b>practically</b> empty.</i>
<b>profound</b>	Profound quality. <i>Expressing <b>profound</b> truths in simple language.</i>
<b>redoubtable</b>	Inspiring fear. <i>He was a <b>redoubtable</b> debater.</i>
<b>staggering</b>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The <b>staggering</b> bills for maintenance and repair.</i>
<b>surprising</b>	Causing surprise; unexpected. <i>The report shows a <b>surprising</b> lack of hard factual data.</i>
<b>unacceptable</b>	Not satisfactory or allowable. <i>The following use of access was judged <b>unacceptable</b> by a panel of linguists You can access your cash at any of 300 automatic tellers.</i>
<b>unbelievable</b>	Beyond belief or understanding. <i><b>Unbelievable</b> or not it happened.</i>
<b>unbelievably</b>	Not easy to believe. <i><b>Unbelievably</b> all this is yours for 50p.</i>
<b>unconvincing</b>	Failing to make someone believe that something is true or valid. <i>As <b>unconvincing</b> as a forced smile.</i>
<b>unexpectedly</b>	In a way that was not expected or regarded as likely. <i>He died <b>unexpectedly</b> of a heart attack.</i>
<b>unimaginable</b>	Difficult or impossible to imagine or comprehend. <i>Lives of almost <b>unimaginable</b> deprivation.</i>
<b>unlikely</b>	Not likely to be true or to occur or to have occurred. <i>It is <b>unlikely</b> that they will ever be used.</i>
<b>unthinkable</b>	(of a situation or event) too unlikely or undesirable to be considered a possibility. <i>The <b>unthinkable</b> happened I spoke up.</i>
