Definitions of "Inconceivable" as an adjective

- *Not capable of being imagined or grasped mentally; unbelievable.*
- *Totally unlikely.*

Synonyms of "Inconceivable" as an adjective (8 Words)

impossible	Not able to occur, exist, or be done. <i>An impossible dream.</i>
incredible	Very good; wonderful. <i>At incredible speed.</i>
not in the least likely	Holding office.
out of the question	Knocked unconscious by a heavy blow.
unbelievable	Not able to be believed; unlikely to be true. <i>Unbelievable or not it happened.</i>
unimaginable	Difficult or impossible to imagine or comprehend. <i>Lives of almost unimaginable deprivation.</i>

unimagined	Not having been imagined or thought of as possible. <i>A previously unimagined degree of economic and social freedom.</i>
unthinkable	Incapable of being conceived or considered. <i>The unthinkable happened I spoke up.</i>

Usage Examples of "Inconceivable" as an adjective

- *They behaved with inconceivable cruelty.*
- *It seemed inconceivable that the president had been unaware of what was going on.*

Associations of "Inconceivable" (30 Words)

amaze	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>She amazed doctors by fighting back when her deteriorating condition caused her to suffer heart failure.</i>
amazing	Inspiring awe or admiration or wonder. <i>An amazing number of people registered.</i>
astonish	Surprise or impress (someone) greatly. <i>It astonished her that he was so anxious.</i>
astonishing	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>An astonishing achievement.</i>
astound	Shock or greatly surprise. <i>Her bluntness astounded him.</i>
astounding	Surprisingly impressive or notable. <i>The summit offers astounding views.</i>
difficult	Characterized by or causing hardships or problems. <i>Lily could be difficult.</i>
implausible	Having a quality that provokes disbelief. <i>Gave the teacher an implausible excuse.</i>
impossible	Not capable of occurring or being accomplished or dealt with. <i>What an arrogant impossible fool.</i>
impracticable	(of a course of action) impossible in practice to do or carry out. <i>Refloating the sunken ship proved impracticable because of its fragility.</i>
improbable	Too improbable to admit of belief. <i>The characters have improbable names.</i>
incredible	Very good; wonderful. <i>An almost incredible tale of triumph and tragedy.</i>

incredibly	Used to introduce a statement that is hard to believe; strangely. <i>Incredibly she survived the crash.</i>
levity	Feeling an inappropriate lack of seriousness. <i>As an attempt to introduce a note of levity the words were a disastrous flop.</i>
marvelous	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>A marvelous collection of rare books.</i>
miraculously	In a miraculous manner. <i>The two drivers miraculously escaped with only minor injuries.</i>
practically	For all practical purposes but not completely. <i>The place was practically empty.</i>
profound	Profound quality. <i>Expressing profound truths in simple language.</i>
redoubtable	Inspiring fear. <i>He was a redoubtable debater.</i>
staggering	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The staggering bills for maintenance and repair.</i>
surprising	Causing surprise; unexpected. <i>The report shows a surprising lack of hard factual data.</i>
unacceptable	Not satisfactory or allowable. <i>The following use of access was judged unacceptable by a panel of linguists You can access your cash at any of 300 automatic tellers.</i>
unbelievable	Beyond belief or understanding. <i>Unbelievable or not it happened.</i>
unbelievably	Not easy to believe. <i>Unbelievably all this is yours for 50p.</i>
unconvincing	Failing to make someone believe that something is true or valid. <i>As unconvincing as a forced smile.</i>
unexpectedly	In a way that was not expected or regarded as likely. <i>He died unexpectedly of a heart attack.</i>
unimaginable	Difficult or impossible to imagine or comprehend. <i>Lives of almost unimaginable deprivation.</i>
unlikely	Not likely to be true or to occur or to have occurred. <i>It is unlikely that they will ever be used.</i>
unthinkable	(of a situation or event) too unlikely or undesirable to be considered a possibility. <i>The unthinkable happened I spoke up.</i>

Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers.
