unimagined Not having been imagined or thought of as possible.

A previously **unimagined** degree of economic and social freedom.

unthinkable Incapable of being conceived or considered.

The **unthinkable** happened I spoke up.

Usage Examples of "Inconceivable" as an adjective

• They behaved with inconceivable cruelty.

• It seemed inconceivable that the president had been unaware of what was going on.

amazing Inspiring awe or admiration or wonder.

astonish Surprise or impress (someone) greatly.

It **astonish**ed her that he was so anxious.

astonishing So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm.

An **astonishing** achievement.

astound Shock or greatly surprise.

Her bluntness **astound**ed him.

astounding Surprisingly impressive or notable. *The summit offers astounding views.*

Characterized by or causing hardships or problems.

difficult

Lily could be difficult.

Lily could be **aifficult**.

implausible Having a quality that provokes disbelief. *Gave the teacher an implausible excuse.*

Not capable of occurring or being accomplished or dealt with.

impossible What an arrogant impossible fool.

impracticable (of a course of action) impossible in practice to do or carry out.

Refloating the sunken ship proved **impracticable** because of its fragility.

Too improbable to admit of belief.

improbable The characters have improbable names.

Very good; wonderful.

incredible An almost incredible tale of triumph and tragedy.



Used to introduce a statement that is hard to believe; strangely. incredibly

Incredibly she survived the crash.

Feeling an inappropriate lack of seriousness.

levity As an attempt to introduce a note of **levity** the words were a disastrous

flop.

Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers. marvelous

A marvelous collection of rare books.

In a miraculous manner. miraculously

The two drivers **miraculously** escaped with only minor injuries.

For all practical purposes but not completely. **practically**

The place was **practically** empty.

Profound quality. profound

Expressing **profound** truths in simple language.

Inspiring fear. redoubtable

He was a **redoubtable** debater.

So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. staggering

The **staggering** bills for maintenance and repair.

Causing surprise; unexpected. **surprising**

The report shows a **surprising** lack of hard factual data.

Not satisfactory or allowable.

unacceptable The following use of access was judged **unacceptable** by a panel of

linguists You can access your cash at any of 300 automatic tellers.

Beyond belief or understanding. unbelievable

Unbelievable or not it happened.

Not easy to believe. unbelievably

Failing to make someone believe that something is true or valid. unconvincing

In a way that was not expected or regarded as likely. unexpectedly

He died **unexpectedly** of a heart attack.

Not likely to be true or to occur or to have occurred. <u>unlikely</u>

It is **unlikely** that they will ever be used.
