## Associations of "Incongruent" (30 Words)

<b>absurd</b>	An absurd state of affairs. <i>The incidents that followed bordered on the <b>absurd</b>.</i>
<b>absurdity</b>	The quality or state of being ridiculous or wildly unreasonable. <i>Duncan laughed at the <b>absurdity</b> of the situation.</i>
<b>foolish</b>	Lacking good sense or judgement; unwise. <i>He was <b>foolish</b> enough to confide in her.</i>
<b>garbled</b>	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>I got a <b>garbled</b> set of directions.</i>
<b>illogical</b>	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>An <b>illogical</b> fear of the supernatural.</i>
<b>immoral</b>	Not adhering to ethical or moral principles. <i>Unseemly and <b>immoral</b> behaviour.</i>
<b>impolitic</b>	Not politic. <i>It was <b>impolitic</b> to pay the slightest tribute to the enemy.</i>
<b>inadvisable</b>	Not prudent or wise; not recommended. <i>It would be <b>inadvisable</b> to involve more than one architect.</i>
<b>inappropriate</b>	Not in keeping with what is correct or proper. <i><b>Inappropriate</b> shoes for a walk on the beach.</i>
<b>incongruity</b>	The quality of disagreeing; being unsuitable and inappropriate. <i>The <b>incongruity</b> of his fleshy face and skinny body disturbed her.</i>
<a href="#">incongruous</a>	Not in harmony or keeping with the surroundings or other aspects of something. <i>The duffel coat looked <b>incongruous</b> with the black dress she wore underneath.</i>
<b>indecent</b>	Offending against sexual mores in conduct or appearance. <i>A bathing suit considered <b>indecent</b> by local standards.</i>

<b><u>indecorous</u></b>	Not in keeping with good taste and propriety; improper. <i>A pub crawl with sundry <b>indecorous</b> adventures.</i>
<b>indelicate</b>	In violation of good taste even verging on the indecent. <i>Forgive me asking an <b>indelicate</b> question but how are you off for money.</i>
<b>inexpedient</b>	Not suitable or advisable. <i>An <b>inexpedient</b> tactic.</i>
<b>injudicious</b>	Showing very poor judgement; unwise. <i>An <b>injudicious</b> measure.</i>
<b><u>invalid</u></b>	Injure permanently. <i><b>Invalid</b> reasoning.</i>
<b><u>irrational</u></b>	Of a number quantity or expression not expressible as a ratio of two integers and having an infinite and non recurring expansion when expressed as a decimal Examples of irrational numbers are the number and the square root of 2. <i><b>Irrational</b> feelings of hostility.</i>
<b><u>ludicrous</u></b>	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>Every night he wore a <b>ludicrous</b> outfit.</i>
<b>preposterous</b>	Contrary to reason or common sense; utterly absurd or ridiculous. <i>A <b>preposterous</b> suggestion.</i>
<b>ridiculous</b>	Deserving or inviting derision or mockery; absurd. <i>That <b>ridiculous</b> tartan cap.</i>
<b>salience</b>	The state of being salient. <i>The political <b>salience</b> of religion has a considerable impact.</i>
<b><u>superstitious</u></b>	Showing ignorance of the laws of nature and faith in magic or chance. <i>Many <b>superstitious</b> beliefs and practices are connected with sneezing.</i>
<b><u>unbecoming</u></b>	(especially of clothing or a colour) not flattering. <i>Language <b>unbecoming</b> to a lady.</i>
<b><u>unfit</u></b>	Make unfit or unsuitable. <i>Drunk and <b>unfit</b> for service.</i>
<b><u>unreasonable</u></b>	Beyond normal limits. <i>An <b>unreasonable</b> request.</i>
<b>unseemly</b>	(of behaviour or actions) not proper or appropriate. <i>An <b>unseemly</b> squabble.</i>
<b><u>unsound</u></b>	Physically unsound or diseased. <i>This line of argument is <b>unsound</b>.</i>
<b><u>unsuitable</u></b>	Not conducive to good moral development. <i>The display is <b>unsuitable</b> for young children.</i>
