inappropriate Not in keeping with what is correct or proper.

incompatible (of two things) so different in nature as to be incapable of coexisting.

Incompatible colors.

inconsistent Displaying a lack of consistency.

The quality of the material was often **inconsistent**.

mismatched (of a contest or contestants) not fairly matched as opponents.

A pair of **mismatched** cops.

not in harmony Holding office.

out of keeping Outside or external.out of place Outside or external.

unharmonious Not harmonious.

The **unharmonious** noise of town life.

unsuitableNot worthy of being chosen (especially as a spouse.

A solvent **unsuitable** for use on wood surfaces.

unsuited Not easy to combine harmoniously.

He was totally **unsuited** for the job.

Usage Examples of "Incongruous" as an adjective

The duffel coat looked incongruous with the black dress she wore underneath.

Relating to or having an antisocial personality disorder.

antisocial Criminal behavior or conduct that violates the rights of other individuals is

antisocial.

conflicting Incompatible or at variance; contradictory.

Conflicting opinions.

contradiction Opposition between two conflicting forces or ideas.

The statement he is brave and he is not brave is a **contradiction**.

contradictory A contradictory proposition.

Perfect and imperfect are **contradictory** terms.

discordant (of sounds) harsh and jarring because of a lack of harmony.

Views **discordant** with present day ideas.

Characterized by an illogical or surprising lack of compatibility or

discrepant similarity.

Widely **discrepant** statements.

dissonant Unsuitable or unusual in combination; clashing.

Jackson employs both harmonious and **dissonant** colour choices.

illogical Lacking in correct logical relation.

An **illogical** fear of the supernatural.

inappropriate Not suitable for a particular occasion etc.

It would be **inappropriate** for me to comment.

inapt Not elegant or graceful in expression.

A more **inapt** name I cannot imagine.

incompatible (of two people) unable to live together harmoniously.

Although convinced that they were **incompatible** she loved him.

incongruent Not congruent.

incongruity

The quality of disagreeing; being unsuitable and inappropriate.

The **incongruity** of his fleshy face and skinny body disturbed her.

The fact or state of being inconsistent.

inconsistency The **inconsistency** between his expressed attitudes and his actual

behaviour.

inconsistent Not in agreement.

The quality of the material was often **inconsistent**.

Not in harmony.

inharmonious An **inharmonious** negative state of mind.

(of a person) unfriendly and unwelcoming towards people.

inhospitable (of a person) unificially and unification areas.



irony

A literary technique, originally used in Greek tragedy, by which the full

significance of a character's words or actions is clear to the audience or

reader although unknown to the character.

The **irony** is that I thought he could help me.

oxymoron Conjoining contradictory terms (as in `deafening silence.

A statement that contradicts itself.

The liar **paradox**.

sarcasm Witty language used to convey insults or scorn.

He used **sarcasm** to upset his opponent.

unfriendly Not friendly.

An **unfriendly** action to take.

unlike Marked by dissimilarity.

He was very **unlike** to any other man.

(of the hours of work of a job) falling outside the normal working day and

unsocial thus socially inconvenient.

The **unsocial** disposition to neglect one s neighbors.

Physically unsound or diseased.

This line of argument is **unsound**.

unsuitable

Not conducive to good moral development.

The movie is unsuitable for children.

unsuited Not right or appropriate.

He was totally **unsuited** for the job.
