#### Definitions of "Inconsiderate" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "inconsiderate" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Lacking regard for the rights or feelings of others.
- Without proper consideration or reflection.
- Thoughtlessly causing hurt or inconvenience to others.

#### Synonyms of "Inconsiderate" as an adjective (20 Words)

<u>discourteous</u>	Lacking social graces. It would be unkind and <b>discourteous</b> to decline a visit.
disrespectful	Showing a lack of respect or courtesy; impolite. <i>Disrespectful</i> in the presence of his parents.
heedless	Characterized by careless unconcern. <i>Elaine she shouted <b>heedless</b> of attracting unwanted attention</i>
impolite	Not having or showing good manners; rude. It would have been <b>impolite</b> to refuse.



<u>insensitive</u>	Showing or feeling no concern for others' feelings. An <b>insensitive</b> remark.
rude	Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by simplicity and often crudeness. She had been <b>rude</b> to her boss.
self-centred	Limited to or caring only about yourself and your own needs.
self-seeking	Interested only in yourself.
selfish	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others. <i>I joined them for <b>selfish</b> reasons.</i>
<u>thoughtless</u>	Without care or thought for others. The debate turned into <b>thoughtless</b> bickering.
<u>uncaring</u>	Lacking affection or warm feeling. An <b>uncaring</b> person.
uncharitable	(of a person's behaviour or attitude towards others) unkind; unsympathetic. <i>All pious words and <b>uncharitable</b> deeds.</i>
<u>unconcerned</u>	Lacking in interest or care or feeling. The prisoner seems entirely <b>unconcerned</b> as to the outcome of the examination.
unconsidered	Without proper consideration or reflection. <i>Unconsidered</i> words.
ungracious	Not graceful or elegant. <b>Ungracious</b> behavior.
<u>unkind</u>	Inconsiderate and harsh to others. <i>He was the butt of some <b>unkind</b> jokes.</i>
unmindful	Not mindful or attentive. Not <b>unmindful</b> of the heavy responsibility.
unsympathetic	(of a person) not friendly or cooperative; unlikeable. <i>His dignity made him seem aloof and <b>unsympathetic</b>.</i>
unthinking	Not exhibiting or characterized by careful thought. She was at pains to correct <b>unthinking</b> prejudices.
unthoughtful	Showing little or no consideration for the needs of other people; thoughtless. <i>How could she be so unthoughtful as to depart at such an awkward hour.</i>



### Usage Examples of "Inconsiderate" as an adjective

- Shockingly inconsiderate behavior.
- It's inconsiderate of her to go away without telling us.

# Associations of "Inconsiderate" (30 Words)

<u>act</u>	Take action do something. In what capacity are you <b>act</b> ing.
attitude	A position in which one leg is lifted behind with the knee bent at right angles and turned out, and the corresponding arm is raised above the head, the other extended to the side. <i>The boy was standing in an attitude of despair.</i>
<u>behave</u>	Behave in a certain manner. They were expected to <b>behave</b> themselves.
behavior	Behavioral attributes the way a person behaves toward other people. The <b>behavior</b> of small particles can be studied in experiments.
behaviour	The way in which a machine or natural phenomenon works or functions. <i>He will vouch for her good <b>behaviour</b>.</i>
bungling	Showing lack of skill or aptitude. He was heavily criticized for his <b>bungling</b> of the case.
<u>careless</u>	(of an action or its result) showing or caused by a lack of attention. <i>He was <b>careless</b> of his own safety.</i>
clumsy	Done awkwardly or without skill. <i>Clumsy fingers.</i>
comport	Behave in a certain manner. They do all that nature and art can do to <b>comport</b> with his will.
conduct	Transmit a form of energy such as heat or electricity by conduction. <i>He <b>conduct</b>ed us through his personal gallery of the Civil War</i> .
<u>demeanor</u>	(behavioral attributes) the way a person behaves toward other people.
ethology	The science of animal behaviour.
forgetful	Not mindful or attentive. She was soon <b>forgetful</b> of the time.
gauche	Unsophisticated and socially awkward. A shy and <b>gauche</b> teenager.



geek	Be or become extremely excited or enthusiastic about a subject, typically one of specialist or minority interest. <i>I am totally</i> <b>geek</b> <i>ing out over this upcoming film.</i>
<u>handling</u>	Manual (or mechanical) carrying or moving or delivering or working with something. <i>The handling of prisoners.</i>
headlong	In a hasty and foolhardy manner. A <b>headlong</b> rush to sell.
inattentive	Failing to attend to the comfort or wishes of others. A particularly dull and <b>inattentive</b> pupil.
incompetent	An incompetent person. <i>The filming was hopeless incompetent</i> .
<u>ineffective</u>	Not producing any significant or desired effect. An <i>ineffective</i> administration.
inept	Revealing lack of perceptiveness or judgment or finesse. <i>Inept</i> handling of the account.
maladroit	Inefficient or inept; clumsy. A <b>maladroit</b> movement of his hand caused the car to swerve.
neglectful	Not giving proper care or attention to someone or something. <i>Neglectful</i> parents.
rashly	Without careful consideration of the possible consequences; impetuously. <i>Rashly Theresa accepts a second date with Tony</i> .
remiss	Lacking care or attention to duty; negligent. It would be very <b>remiss</b> of me not to pass on that information.
<u>sloppy</u>	Lacking neatness or order. <i>Sloppy</i> workmanship.
<u>tactless</u>	Revealing lack of perceptiveness or judgment or finesse. In the circumstances it was <b>tactless</b> to ask her age.
unmindful	Not mindful or attentive- G.B.Shaw. Not <b>unmindful</b> of the heavy responsibility.
<u>unskilled</u>	Not having or requiring special skill or training. Workers in <b>unskilled</b> occupations are finding fewer and fewer job opportunities.
unskillful	Poorly done. It was an <b>unskillful</b> attempt.
