- Without proper consideration or reflection.
- Thoughtlessly causing hurt or inconvenience to others.

## Synonyms of "Inconsiderate" as an adjective (20 Words)

**discourteous** Lacking social graces.

It would be unkind and **discourteous** to decline a visit.

disrespectful Showing a lack of respect or courtesy; impolite.

**Disrespectful** in the presence of his parents.

heedless Characterized by careless unconcern.

*Elaine she shouted* **heedless** *of attracting unwanted attention.* 

impolite Not having or showing good manners; rude.

It would have been **impolite** to refuse.



**insensitive** Showing or feeling no concern for others' feelings.

An **insensitive** remark.

Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by

**rude** simplicity and often crudeness.

She had been **rude** to her boss.

**self-centred** Limited to or caring only about yourself and your own needs.

**self-seeking** Interested only in yourself.

Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the

**selfish** exclusion of others.

I joined them for **selfish** reasons.

thoughtless Without care or thought for others.

The debate turned into **thoughtless** bickering.

**uncaring** Lacking affection or warm feeling.

An **uncaring** person.

(of a person's behaviour or attitude towards others) unkind;

**uncharitable** unsympathetic.

All pious words and uncharitable deeds.

Lacking in interest or care or feeling.

**unconcerned** The prisoner seems entirely **unconcerned** as to the outcome of the

examination.

**unconsidered** Without proper consideration or reflection.

**Unconsidered** words.

ungracious Not graceful or elegant.

**Ungracious** behavior.

unkind Inconsiderate and harsh to others.

He was the butt of some **unkind** jokes.

unmindful Not mindful or attentive.

Not **unmindful** of the heavy responsibility.

unsympathetic (of a person) not friendly or cooperative; unlikeable.

His dignity made him seem aloof and **unsympathetic**.

unthinking Not exhibiting or characterized by careful thought.

She was at pains to correct **unthinking** prejudices.

Showing little or no consideration for the needs of other people;

thoughtless.

**unthoughtful** How could she be so **unthoughtful** as to depart at such an awkward

hour.

**behaviour** The way in which a machine or natural phenomenon works or functions.

He will vouch for her good **behaviour**.

**bungling** Showing lack of skill or aptitude.

He was heavily criticized for his **bungling** of the case.

careless (of an action or its result) showing or caused by a lack of attention.

He was **careless** of his own safety.

clumsy Done awkwardly or without skill.

**Clumsy** fingers.

**comport**Behave in a certain manner.

They do all that nature and art can do to **comport** with his will.

**conduct**Transmit a form of energy such as heat or electricity by conduction.

He **conduct**ed us through his personal gallery of the Civil War.

**demeanor** (behavioral attributes) the way a person behaves toward other people.

**ethology** The science of animal behaviour.

forgetful Not mindful or attentive.

She was soon **forgetful** of the time.

Unsophisticated and socially awkward.

gauche

A shy and gauche teenager.



Be or become extremely excited or enthusiastic about a subject, typically

**geek** one of specialist or minority interest.

I am totally **geek**ing out over this upcoming film.

Manual (or mechanical) carrying or moving or delivering or working with

**handling** something.

The **handling** of prisoners.

**headlong** In a hasty and foolhardy manner. A **headlong** rush to sell.

Failing to attend to the comfort or wishes of others.

inattentive A particularly dull and inattentive pupil.

incompetent An incompetent person.

The filming was hopeless **incompetent**.

ineffective Not producing any significant or desired effect.

An **ineffective** administration.

**inept** Revealing lack of perceptiveness or judgment or finesse.

**Inept** handling of the account.

maladroit Inefficient or inept; clumsy.

A maladroit movement of his hand caused the car to swerve.

neglectful Not giving proper care or attention to someone or something.

**Neglection** Neglectful parents.

rashly Without careful consideration of the possible consequences; impetuously.

**Rashly** Theresa accepts a second date with Tony.

remiss Lacking care or attention to duty; negligent.

It would be very **remiss** of me not to pass on that information.

**sloppy** Lacking neatness or order.

**Sloppy** workmanship.

Revealing lack of perceptiveness or judgment or finesse.

In the circumstances it was **tactless** to ask her age.

unmindful Not mindful or attentive- G.B.Shaw.

Not **unmindful** of the heavy responsibility.

Not having or requiring special skill or training.

**unskilled** Workers in **unskilled** occupations are finding fewer and fewer job

opportunities.

unskillful Poorly done.

It was an **unskillful** attempt.
