Synonyms of "Inconspicuous" as an adjective (14 Words)

concealed	Hidden on any grounds for any motive. <i>Concealed or hidden damage.</i>
<u>discreet</u>	Unobtrusively perceptive and sympathetic. <i>We made some discreet inquiries.</i>
<u>hidden</u>	Difficult to find. <i>A hidden cave.</i>
<u>invisible</u>	Concealed from sight; hidden. <i>This invisible gas is present to some extent in every home.</i>
<u>modest</u>	Humble in spirit or manner; suggesting retiring mildness or even cowed submissiveness. <i>A modest salary.</i>
<u>unassuming</u>	Not pretentious or arrogant; modest. <i>He was an unassuming and kindly man.</i>
undistinguished	Not worthy of notice. <i>An undistinguished career.</i>
unexceptional	Not special in any way; lacking distinction. <i>A unexceptional incident as can be found in a lawyer's career.</i>
unimposing	Not imposing or impressive in appearance. <i>The king was small white haired and quite unimposing.</i>
<u>unnoticeable</u>	Not obtrusive or undesirably noticeable. <i>Her clothes were simple and unnoticeable.</i>
<u>unobtrusive</u>	Not conspicuous or attracting attention. <i>A quiet unobtrusive life of self denial.</i>
unostentatious	Exhibiting restrained good taste. <i>His unostentatious office.</i>
<u>unremarkable</u>	Not particularly interesting or surprising. <i>An unremarkable house.</i>
unspectacular	Not spectacular. <i>An unspectacular but necessary task.</i>



Usage Examples of "Inconspicuous" as an adjective

- *An inconspicuous red-brick building.*
- *He pushed the string through an inconspicuous hole.*

Associations of "Inconspicuous" (30 Words)

ambiguous

Having more than one possible meaning.
*The election result was **ambiguous**.*

blur

Make unclear indistinct or blurred.
*It was kinda funny seeing how **blur** someone can be when having to do a task they have no clue about.*

blurred

Unclear in form or expression- H.G.Wells.
*The camera caught only two **blurred** images.*

blurry	Not clearly or distinctly visible or audible. <i>My memories of him are blurry at best.</i>
concealed	Not accessible to view. <i>A concealed weapon.</i>
dim	Become dim or lusterless. <i>A dim figure in the distance.</i>
elusive	Making great mental demands; hard to comprehend or solve or believe. <i>That elusive thing the soul.</i>
equivocal	Open to two or more interpretations; or of uncertain nature or significance; or (often) intended to mislead. <i>The officer s equivocal behavior increased the victim s uneasiness.</i>
faint	(of a sight, smell, or sound) barely perceptible. <i>There is a faint chance that the enemy may flee.</i>
hazy	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>The picture we have of him is extremely hazy.</i>
hidden	Difficult to find. <i>A hidden room or place of concealment such as a priest hole.</i>
illegibility	The quality of writing (print or handwriting) that cannot be deciphered.
imprecision	Lack of exactness or accuracy. <i>All scientific measurements come with some degree of imprecision.</i>
indefinite	Not decided or not known. <i>Must you be so indefinite.</i>
indistinct	Not clear or sharply defined. <i>Only indistinct notions of what to do.</i>
invisible	Invisible exports and imports. <i>Invisible rays.</i>
lightproof	Not penetrable by light. <i>A lightproof envelope.</i>
nebulous	(of a concept) vague or ill-defined. <i>Nebulous reasons.</i>
obscure	Make obscure or unclear. <i>The distinction was obscured.</i>
opaque	A substance for producing opaque areas on negatives. <i>Opaque windows of the jail.</i>
recondite	Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding or knowledge. <i>The book is full of recondite information.</i>

<u>subtlety</u>	The quality or state of being subtle. <i>The textural subtlety of Degas.</i>
turbid	Confused or obscure in meaning or effect. <i>The turbid estuary.</i>
<u>unappreciated</u>	Not likely to be rewarded. <i>She had been brought up in a family where she felt unappreciated and undervalued.</i>
<u>unclear</u>	Not clear to the mind. <i>The law itself was unclear on that point.</i>
undifferentiated	Not different or differentiated. <i>By six weeks the sexual glands are as yet undifferentiated between male and female.</i>
<u>unnoticeable</u>	Not noticeable; not drawing attention- J.G.Cozzens. <i>Her clothes were simple and unnoticeable.</i>
<u>unobtrusive</u>	Not obtrusive or undesirably noticeable. <i>The service was unobtrusive and efficient.</i>
unsung	Having value that is not acknowledged. <i>Unsung heroes of the war.</i>
<u>vague</u>	Lacking clarity or distinctness. <i>Vague forms of speech have so long passed for mysteries of science.</i>
