- *Advancing in amount or intensity.*



## Synonyms of "Increasingly" as an adverb (6 Words)

**continuously more** At every point.

**gradually more** In a gradual manner.

**growingly** Increasingly; more and more.  
*A **growingly** complex urban culture.*

**more and more** Comparative of much; to a greater degree or extent.

**progressively** Advancing in amount or intensity.  
*Successive governments **progressively** increased expenditure on welfare.*

**steadily more** At a steady rate or pace.

<b>addition</b>	The act of adding one thing to another. <i>The <b>addition</b> of flowers created a pleasing effect.</i>
<b>advance</b>	Pay in advance. <i>The hypothesis I wish to <b>advance</b> in this article.</i>
<b>affluence</b>	Abundant wealth. <i>A sign of our growing <b>affluence</b>.</i>
<b>also</b>	In addition; too. <i><b>Also</b> a car is very expensive to run.</i>

<b>amplification</b>	The amount of increase in signal power or voltage or current expressed as the ratio of output to input. <i>A technique known as random <b>amplification</b> of polymorphic DNA.</i>
<b>augment</b>	Make (something) greater by adding to it; increase. <i>He <b>augmented</b> his summer income by painting houses.</i>
<b>augmentation</b>	The statement of a theme in notes of greater duration (usually twice the length of the original). <i>The <b>augmentation</b> of the curriculum with new subjects.</i>
<b>better</b>	The better one that which is better. <i>Well fed people are <b>better</b> able to fight off infection.</i>
<b>boom</b>	Make a loud, deep, resonant sound. <i>A dozen bitterns <b>boom</b> mysteriously from the reeds.</i>
<b>considerably</b>	By a notably large amount or to a notably large extent; greatly. <i>A <b>considerably</b> higher density.</i>
<b>doubly</b>	To twice the normal extent or degree; especially. <i>She was <b>doubly</b> rewarded.</i>
<b>enlarge</b>	Make or become larger or more extensive. <i>She <b>enlarged</b> the flower beds.</i>
<b>expand</b>	Expand the influence of. <i>The minister <b>expanded</b> on the government's proposals.</i>
<b>expanded</b>	Relatively broad in shape. <i>The <b>expanded</b> fins of the ray.</i>
<b>extension</b>	The ability to raise the working leg high in the air. <i>Contact Liz McDonald on <b>extension</b> 3514.</i>
<b>further</b>	In addition or furthermore. <i>Let's not discuss it <b>further</b>.</i>
<b>greatly</b>	By a considerable amount; very much. <i>I admire him <b>greatly</b>.</i>
<b>improving</b>	Giving moral or intellectual benefit. <i>A large <b>improving</b> picture hung opposite.</i>
<b>increase</b>	The amount by which something increases. <i>We are aiming to <b>increase</b> awareness of social issues.</i>
<b>increasing</b>	Music increasing in tempo and or volume. <i><b>Increasing</b> prices.</i>
<b>inflated</b>	Pretentious (especially with regard to language or ideals). <i><b>Inflated</b> salaries.</i>

<b>many</b>	The majority of people. <i>Too <b>many</b> clouds to see.</i>
<b>more</b>	Forming the comparative of adjectives and adverbs especially those of more than one syllable. <i>Repeat once <b>more</b>.</i>
<b>moreover</b>	In addition. <i>The cellar was dark <b>moreover</b> mice nested there.</i>
<b>most</b>	Almost. <i>What attracts the <b>most</b> attention.</i>
<b>mounting</b>	The action of mounting something. <i>The <b>mounting</b> of rapid fire guns.</i>
<b>much</b>	To a great extent; a great deal. <i><b>Much</b> grain is in storage.</i>
