- *To an increasing extent; more and more.*
- *Advancing in amount or intensity.*



Synonyms of "Increasingly" as an adverb (6 Words)

continuously more At every point.

gradually more In a gradual manner.

growingly Increasingly; more and more.
*A **growingly** complex urban culture.*

more and more Comparative of much; to a greater degree or extent.

progressively Advancing in amount or intensity.
*Successive governments **progressively** increased expenditure on welfare.*

steadily more At a steady rate or pace.

- *An increasingly difficult situation.*
- *She became increasingly depressed.*

expand	Expand the influence of. <i>The minister expanded on the government's proposals.</i>
expanded	Relatively broad in shape. <i>The expanded fins of the ray.</i>
extension	The ability to raise the working leg high in the air. <i>Contact Liz McDonald on extension 3514.</i>
further	In addition or furthermore. <i>Let's not discuss it further.</i>
greatly	By a considerable amount; very much. <i>I admire him greatly.</i>
improving	Giving moral or intellectual benefit. <i>A large improving picture hung opposite.</i>
increase	The amount by which something increases. <i>We are aiming to increase awareness of social issues.</i>
increasing	Music increasing in tempo and or volume. <i>Increasing prices.</i>
inflated	Pretentious (especially with regard to language or ideals). <i>Inflated salaries.</i>

many	The majority of people. <i>Too many clouds to see.</i>
more	Forming the comparative of adjectives and adverbs especially those of more than one syllable. <i>Repeat once more.</i>
moreover	In addition. <i>The cellar was dark moreover mice nested there.</i>
most	Almost. <i>What attracts the most attention.</i>
mounting	The action of mounting something. <i>The mounting of rapid fire guns.</i>
much	To a great extent; a great deal. <i>Much grain is in storage.</i>
