## Incur as a Verb

### Definitions of "Incur" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “incur” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Receive a specified treatment (abstract).*
- *Become subject to (something unwelcome or unpleasant) as a result of one's own behaviour or actions.*
- *Make oneself subject to; bring upon oneself; become liable to.*



## Synonyms of "Incur" as a verb (10 Words)

- bring upon oneself** Take something or somebody with oneself somewhere.
- experience** Undergo or live through a difficult experience.  
*An opportunity to **experience** the excitement of New York.*
- expose oneself to** Put in a dangerous, disadvantageous, or difficult position.
- find** Get or find back recover the use of.  
***Find** the product of two numbers.*
- get** Take vengeance on or get even.  
*I might be **getting** the flu.*
- lay oneself open to** Impose as a duty, burden, or punishment.
- obtain** Be valid, applicable, or true.  
*Adequate insurance cover is difficult to **obtain**.*
- receive** Receive a specified treatment abstract.  
*He **received** Christ.*
- suffer** Undergo or suffer.  
*He **suffered** intense pain.*

**sustain** Bear (the weight of an object) without breaking or falling.  
*She alone **sustained** her family.*

<b>acquire</b>	Come to have or undergo a change of (physical features and attributes). <i>He <b>acquired</b> a reputation for scrupulous honesty.</i>
<b>acquired</b>	Gotten through environmental forces. <i><b>Acquired</b> characteristics such as a suntan or a broken nose cannot be passed on.</i>
<b>acquirement</b>	An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>The <b>acquirement</b> of self control.</i>
<b>acquisition</b>	A purchase of one company by another. <i>The legacy will be used for new <b>acquisitions</b>.</i>
<b>attainable</b>	Able to be attained; achievable. <i>Choose an <b>attainable</b> goal.</i>
<b>consequential</b>	Important; significant. <i>A loss of confidence and a <b>consequential</b> withdrawal of funds.</i>
<b>derive</b>	Base a concept on an extension or modification of (another concept). <i>The word man is <b>derived</b> from the Sanskrit manas.</i>
<b>earn</b>	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>Through the years she has <b>earned</b> affection and esteem.</i>
<b>fetch</b>	The action of fetching. <i>The land could <b>fetch</b> over a million pounds.</i>
<b>gain</b>	Derive a benefit from. <i>The peace movement <b>gained</b> momentum.</i>
<b>glean</b>	Gather (leftover grain) after a harvest. <i>Objects <b>gleaned</b> from local markets.</i>
<b>have</b>	Have sex with. <i>The only girl who would <b>have</b> him was the miller s daughter.</i>
<b>invulnerable</b>	Immune to attack; impregnable. <i>No state in the region is now <b>invulnerable</b> to attack by another.</i>

<b>obtain</b>	Come into possession of. <i>How did you <b>obtain</b> the visa.</i>
<b>obtainable</b>	Able to be obtained. <i>Customers financial details are easily <b>obtainable</b>.</i>
<b>own</b>	Have ownership or possession of. <i>Do your <b>own</b> thing.</i>
<b>permission</b>	An official document giving authorization. <i>They had entered the country without <b>permission</b>.</i>
<b>picking</b>	The act of picking crops or fruit or hops etc. <i>He sent the first <b>picking</b> of berries to the market.</i>
<b>possession</b>	A mania restricted to one thing or idea. <i>He remains in full <b>possession</b> of his sanity.</i>
<b>preferment</b>	The act of making accusations. <i>After ordination <b>preferment</b> was fast.</i>
<b>procure</b>	Obtain (someone) as a prostitute for another person. <i>He <b>procured</b> extra cigarettes even though they were rationed.</i>
<b>procurement</b>	The action or occupation of acquiring military equipment and supplies. <i>Defence <b>procurement</b>.</i>
<b>reap</b>	Cut or gather (a crop or harvest). <i>Farmers agreed to continue <b>reaping</b> the land by traditional means.</i>
<b>reassure</b>	Cause to feel sure; give reassurance to. <i>Joachim <b>reassured</b> him that he was needed.</i>
<b>receive</b>	Receive as a retribution or punishment. <i>He <b>received</b> Christ.</i>
<b>regain</b>	Obtain possession or use of (something, typically a quality or ability) again after losing it. <i>They were unable to <b>regain</b> their boats.</i>
<b>secure</b>	Succeed in obtaining (something), especially with difficulty. <i>A <b>secure</b> foundation.</i>
<b>uninjured</b>	(of a person or part of the body) not harmed or damaged. <i>They escaped <b>uninjured</b> when their homes were hit.</i>
<b>wangle</b>	An instance of accomplishing something by scheming or trickery. <i>I think we should be able to <b>wangle</b> it so that you can start tomorrow.</i>
