- *Not clearly defined.*
- Not providing a clear and definite result.
- Not definitely settling something.

double-edged Capable of being interpreted in two usually contradictory ways.

inconclusive Not conclusive; not putting an end to doubt or question.

An **inconclusive** reply.

indefinite Vague or not clearly defined or stated.

Were **indefinite** about their plans.

(of a shoot) not having all the axes terminating in a flower bud and so

indeterminate potentially of indefinite length.

An **indeterminate** stem.

irresolute Uncertain how to act or proceed.

The committee was timid and mediocre and **irresolute**.

Of textures full of small openings or gaps.

open

An open wound.

paradoxical Seemingly contradictory but nonetheless possibly true.

It is paradoxical that standing is more tiring than walking.

tentative Unsettled in mind or opinion.

A **tentative** conclusion.

unclear Poorly stated or described.

Their future remains **unclear**.

Not brought to a conclusion; subject to further thought.

Our position on this bill is still **undecided**.

unsettled Worried and uneasy.

A spell of **unsettled** weather.

Relating to or denoting the weakest of the known kinds of force between

particles which acts only at distances less than about 10 cm is very much

weak weaker than the electromagnetic and the strong interactions and

conserves neither strangeness parity nor isospin.

A weak stress on the second syllable.






Usage Examples of "Indecisive" as an adjective

Lacking decisiveness of character; unable to act or decide quickly or

Her slow **hesitant** way of speaking.

hesitate Be reluctant to do something.

One **hesitate**s over publicizing these things.

hesitating Tentative, unsure, or slow in acting or speaking.

Her **hesitating** gait.

hesitatingly With hesitation; in a hesitant manner.

hesitation The act of pausing uncertainly.

She answered without hesitation.

inconclusive Not leading to a firm conclusion or result; not ending doubt or dispute.

The **inconclusive** committee vote.

The inability to make a decision quickly.

indeterminate Not leading to a definite ending or result.

irresolute Uncertain how to act or proceed.

She stood **irresolute** outside his door.

irresolution Hesitancy; uncertainty.

A moment of **irresolution**.
