Definitions of "Indescribable" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “indescribable” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Too unusual, extreme, or indefinite to be adequately described.*
- *Defying expression or description.*



Synonyms of "Indescribable" as an adjective (9 Words)

- incommunicable** Not able to be communicated to others.
*The pain of separation took the form of an **incommunicable** depression.*
- indefinable** Not able to be defined or described exactly.
*An abstract concept that seems **indefinable**.*
- ineffable** Not to be uttered.
*The **ineffable** Hebrew name that gentiles write as Jehovah.*
- inexpressible** Defying expression.
*A mood of **inexpressible** longing.*
- nameless** Deliberately not identified; anonymous.
*Some pictures were taken by a **nameless** photographer.*

undefinable	Not capable of being precisely or readily described; not easily put into words.
<u>unspeakable</u>	Not able to be expressed in words. <i>I felt an unspeakable tenderness towards her.</i>
untellable	Defying expression or description. <i>A thing of untellable splendor.</i>
unutterable	Defying expression or description. <i>Unutterable consonant clusters.</i>



Usage Examples of "Indescribable" as an adjective

- *Indescribable beauty.*
- *Most prisoners suffered indescribable hardship.*

abominable	Exceptionally bad or displeasing. <i>Abominable workmanship.</i>
acerbity	Sharpness and directness in speech. <i>Their relationship was built on a certain mutual acerbity.</i>
appalling	An experience that appalls. <i>His conduct was appalling.</i>
atrocious	Horrifyingly wicked. <i>Atrocious cruelties.</i>
awful	Awfully very. <i>We re an awful long way from the motorway.</i>

beastly	In a beastly manner. <i>Beastly desires.</i>
<u>bliss</u>	Perfect happiness; great joy. <i>The bliss of heaven.</i>
<u>contentment</u>	A state of happiness and satisfaction. <i>He found contentment in living a simple life in the country.</i>
<u>dreadful</u>	Very unpleasant. <i>The weather was dreadful.</i>
fearsome	Frightening, especially in appearance. <i>The cat mewed displaying a fearsome set of teeth.</i>
frightful	Extreme in degree or extent or amount or impact. <i>Spent a frightful amount of money.</i>
<u>glad</u>	Willing and eager (to do something). <i>Heard the glad news.</i>
happy	Satisfied with the quality or standard of. <i>He was not happy about the proposals.</i>
<u>hellish</u>	Extremely evil or cruel; expressive of cruelty or befitting hell. <i>Hellish torture.</i>
horrible	Provoking horror- Winston Churchill. <i>A horrible massacre.</i>
<u>horrifying</u>	Provoking horror. <i>An alarming even horrifying picture.</i>
ineffable	Not to be uttered. <i>The ineffable mysteries of the soul.</i>
<u>inexplicable</u>	Incapable of being explained or accounted for. <i>Left the house at three in the morning for inexplicable reasons.</i>
inexpressible	Defying expression. <i>A mood of inexpressible longing.</i>
inscrutable	Of an obscure nature- Rachel. <i>The inscrutable workings of Providence.</i>
<u>nasty</u>	Annoying or unwelcome. <i>A nasty trick to pull.</i>
<u>sheer</u>	Cause to sheer. <i>Got the job through sheer persistence.</i>
<u>silent</u>	Not made to sound. <i>A silent dog whistle.</i>
stygian	Hellish.

terrible	Exceptionally bad or displeasing. <i>I was sick all night and felt terrible for two days.</i>
<u>terribly</u>	In a terrible manner. <i>Terribly interesting.</i>
uncommunicative	Unwilling to talk or impart information. <i>The uncommunicative Emily disappeared.</i>
<u>unspeakable</u>	Too sacred to be uttered. <i>Unspeakable happiness.</i>
unutterable	Defying expression or description. <i>Moments of unutterable grief.</i>
