Synonyms of "Indiscriminately" as an adverb (9 Words)

aimlessly	Without aim; in an aimless manner. We wandered aimlessly round Venice.
arbitrarily	On the basis of random choice or personal whim, rather than any reason or system. <i>Recurrent infection is</i> arbitrarily <i>defined as three or more infections a</i> <i>year.</i>
blindly	Without being able to see; unseeingly. Don t blindly accept dogma as justification.



haphazardly	In a random manner. A hodgepodge of family photos haphazardly arranged on a table.
promiscuously	In a licentious and promiscuous manner. This young girl has to share a room with her mother who lives promiscuously .
randomly	In a random manner. The houses were randomly scattered.
uncritically	With a lack of criticism or consideration of whether something is right or wrong. <i>He uncritically accepts lunatic ideas and believes almost anything.</i>
unsystematically	In an unsystematic manner.
willy-nilly	In a random manner.

Usage Examples of "Indiscriminately" as an adverb

- *His armies slaughtered men, women, and children indiscriminately.*
- People who are sedentary and who eat indiscriminately.

Associations of "Indiscriminately" (30 Words)

<u>adjustable</u>	Able to be adjusted. The car has fully adjustable seats and steering wheel.
arbitrarily	In a random manner. <i>Recurrent infection is arbitrarily</i> defined as three or more infections a year.
<u>arbitrary</u>	(of a constant or other quantity) of unspecified value. <i>The arbitrary rule of a dictator.</i>
arrhythmic	Without regard for rhythm. The arrhythmic phrasing of the music.
assigned	Appointed to a post or duty. Assigned duties.
authority	(usually plural) persons who exercise (administrative) control over others. <i>Military forces have the legal</i> authority to arrest drug traffickers.
changeable	Subject to change. <i>Cover the tables with changeable cloths.</i>



discretionary	Denoting or relating to investment funds placed with a broker or manager who has discretion to invest them on the client's behalf. <i>Discretionary funds</i> .
dominate	Be the most important or conspicuous person or thing in. A picturesque city dominate d by the cathedral tower.
extrajudicial	(of a sentence) not legally authorized. An extrajudicial penalty.
<u>haphazard</u>	Lacking any obvious principle of organization. A haphazard plan of action.
haphazardly	In a random manner. A hodgepodge of family photos haphazardly arranged on a table.
impetuosity	Rash impulsiveness.
<u>impetuous</u>	Marked by violent force. <i>Impetuous</i> heaving waves.
indiscriminate	(of a person) not using or exercising discrimination. An indiscriminate mixture of colors and styles.
luck	Success or failure apparently brought by chance rather than through one's own actions. It was my good luck to be there.
option	Buy or sell an option on. His second script will have been option ed by the time you read this.
perfunctorily	In a set manner without serious attention; as a formality. <i>He kissed her cheek perfunctorily.</i>
random	An unknown, unspecified, or odd person. Some random s in the crowd asked Ivan Ljubicic to take a photo for them.
randomize	Make (a set of items, people, etc.) unpredictable, unsystematic, or random in order or arrangement. You can randomize the ingredients with the tap of a button.
randomly	In a random manner. I randomly split the ironing into two piles.
<u>sample</u>	Take a sample or samples of something for analysis. The input signal must be sample d at twice its highest frequency.
sampling	A sample. The list provides a sampling of the many resources available.
selection	A plot of land acquired by selection. The publication of a selection of his poems.



<u>shuffle</u>	A piece of music for or in the style of a shuffle. <i>He</i> shuffle <i>d his funds among different accounts in various countries so as to avoid the IRS.</i>
slapdash	Directly. The shelves were put up slapdash .
slipshod	(of shoes) worn down at the heel. <i>Slipshod</i> spelling.
<u>unjustified</u>	Not shown to be right or reasonable. <i>Unjustified</i> price increases.
<u>unpredictable</u>	Not capable of being foretold. The unpredictable weather of the Scottish islands.
whimsical	Acting or behaving in a capricious manner. The victim of whimsical persecutions.
