promiscuously.

randomly In a random manner.

The houses were **randomly** scattered.

With a lack of criticism or consideration of whether something is right

**uncritically** or wrong.

He **uncritically** accepts lunatic ideas and believes almost anything.

unsystematically In an unsystematic manner.

willy-nilly In a random manner.

• People who are sedentary and who eat indiscriminately.

In a set manner without serious attention; as a formality.

random

Make (a set of items, people, etc.) unpredictable, unsystematic, or random

**randomize** in order or arrangement.

You can **randomize** the ingredients with the tap of a button.

randomly In a random manner.

I **randomly** split the ironing into two piles.

Take a sample or samples of something for analysis.

The input signal must be **sample**d at twice its highest frequency.

A sample.

The list provides a **sampling** of the many resources available.

selection A plot of land acquired by selection.

The publication of a **selection** of his poems.



A piece of music for or in the style of a shuffle.
