According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “individuality” as a noun can have the following definitions:

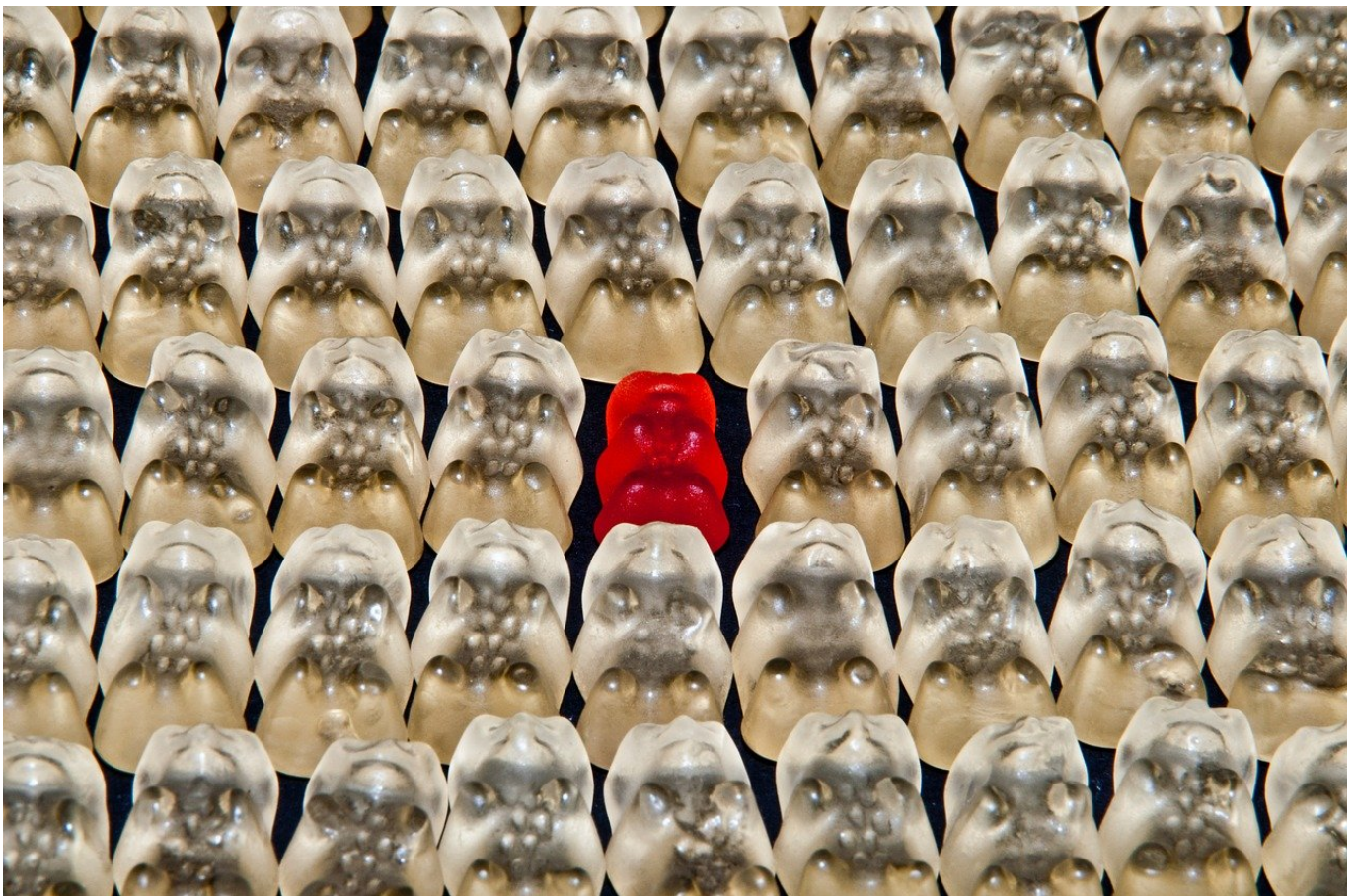
- *Individual characteristics.*

<b>distinctiveness</b>	Utter dissimilarity. <i>Communities are keen to maintain cultural <b>distinctiveness</b>.</i>
<b>identity</b>	The characteristics determining who or what a person or thing is. <i>They shared an <b>identity</b> of interests.</i>

<b>individuation</b>	The quality of being individual.

<b>particularity</b>	Fullness or minuteness of detail in the treatment of something. <i>The central figures of his novels are stripped of their <b>particularity</b>.</i>
<b>peculiarity</b>	An odd or unusual characteristic. <i>His essays characterized decency as a British <b>peculiarity</b>.</i>
<b>personal identity</b>	A short newspaper article about a particular person or group.
<b>separateness</b>	Political independence. <i>Seeking complete political <b>separateness</b> for Taiwan.</i>
<b>singularity</b>	A hypothetical moment in time when artificial intelligence and other technologies have become so advanced that humanity undergoes a dramatic and irreversible change. <i>Maybe the <b>singularity</b> just happened and we didn't notice.</i>
<b>uniqueness</b>	The quality of being particularly remarkable, special, or unusual. <i>Genetic <b>uniqueness</b>.</i>

<b>individualism</b>	The habit or principle of being independent and self-reliant. <i>Encouragement has been given to <b>individualism</b> free enterprise and the pursuit of profit.</i>
<b>individualist</b>	Relating to or characterized by the habit or principle of being independent and self-reliant. <i><b>Individualist</b> capitalism.</i>
<b>individualistic</b>	With minimally restricted freedom in commerce. <i><b>Individualistic</b> cultures where individuals strive for self realization.</i>
<b>individuation</b>	Discriminating the individual from the generic group or species.
<b>indivisible</b>	Unable to be divided or separated. <i>An <b>indivisible</b> union of states.</i>
<b>lone</b>	Characterized by or preferring solitude. <i>A <b>lonely</b> fisherman stood on a tuft of gravel.</i>
<b>lonely</b>	(of a place) unfrequented and remote. <i>A <b>lonely</b> crossroads.</i>
<b>once</b>	As soon as. <i><b>Once</b> two is two.</i>
<b>only</b>	Being the only one single and isolated from others. <i>It s simply the <b>only</b> place to be seen these days.</i>
<b>particular</b>	A detail. <i>He always reasons from the <b>particular</b> to the general.</i>
<b>personal</b>	Of or arising from personality. <i>I have something <b>personal</b> to tell you.</i>
<b>purely</b>	Restricted to something. <i>Act nobly speak <b>purely</b> and think charitably.</i>
<b>respectively</b>	In the order given. <i>They received sentences of one year and eight months <b>respectively</b>.</i>
<b>seclude</b>	Keep (someone) away from other people. <i>I <b>secluded</b> myself up here for a life of study and meditation.</i>
<b>secluded</b>	(of a place) not seen or visited by many people; sheltered and private. <i>The gardens are quiet and <b>secluded</b>.</i>

The singular number.

*A **singular** example.*

sole

Put a new sole on to a shoe.

***Sole** rights of publication.*

solely

Not involving anyone or anything else; only.

*He is **solely** responsible for any debts the company may incur.*

solitary

Lacking companions or companionship.

*I live a pretty **solitary** life.*

unique

A unique person or thing.

*A **unique** opportunity to see the spectacular Bolshoi Ballet.*

uniquely

In a very special or unusual way.

***Uniquely** shaped buildings.*

unshared

Not shared.

*Most of those placed in hostels would prefer **unshared** independent accommodation.*
