- The quality or character of a particular person or thing that distinguishes them from others of the same kind, especially when strongly marked.






## Synonyms of "Individuality" as a noun (12 Words)

<u>distinction</u>	An honor awarded to someone in recognition of achievement or superiority. <i>He learned the <b>distinction</b> between gold and lead.</i>
distinctiveness	Utter dissimilarity. Communities are keen to maintain cultural <b>distinctiveness</b> .
identity	The characteristics determining who or what a person or thing is. They shared an <b>identity</b> of interests.
individualism	Self-centred feeling or conduct; egoism. Encouragement has been given to <b>individualism</b> free enterprise and the pursuit of profit.
individuation	The quality of being individual.
<u>originality</u>	The ability to think and act independently. She s a writer of great <b>originality</b> .



particularity	Fullness or minuteness of detail in the treatment of something. The central figures of his novels are stripped of their <b>particularity</b> .	
peculiarity	An odd or unusual characteristic. His essays characterized decency as a British <b>peculiarity</b> .	
personal identity A short newspaper article about a particular person or group.		
separateness	Political independence. Seeking complete political <b>separateness</b> for Taiwan.	
singularity	A hypothetical moment in time when artificial intelligence and other technologies have become so advanced that humanity undergoes a dramatic and irreversible change. Maybe the <b>singularity</b> just happened and we didn t notice.	
uniqueness	The quality of being particularly remarkable, special, or unusual. <i>Genetic <b>uniqueness</b>.</i>
