accelerate

Increase in rate, amount, or extent.
*He **accelerated** the car.*

agriculture

The class of people engaged in growing food.

automation

Equipment used to achieve automatic control or operation.
***Automation** increases productivity.*

capitalism

An economic system based on private ownership of capital.
*Private ownership is a key feature of **capitalism**.*

city

A town created a city by charter and usually containing a cathedral.
*Ancient Troy was a great **city**.*

civilization

The stage of human social and cultural development and organization that is considered most advanced.
*The early **civilizations** of Mesopotamia and Egypt.*

commercialization	The process of managing or running something principally for financial gain. <i>The escalating commercialization of athletics.</i>
develop	Cause to grow and differentiate in ways conforming to its natural development. <i>He developed a new kind of apple.</i>
economy	A particular system or stage of an economy. <i>A technique based on economy of effort.</i>
expedite	Make (an action or process) happen sooner or be accomplished more quickly. <i>He promised to expedite economic reforms.</i>
globalization	The process by which businesses or other organizations develop international influence or start operating on an international scale. <i>Fears about the increasing globalization of the world economy.</i>
hasten	Move hurriedly. <i>He hastened to refute the assertion.</i>
increase	The amount by which something increases. <i>They proposed an increase of 15 percent in the fare.</i>
industrialize	(of a country or region) build up a system of industries. <i>The Chinese industrialized textile production.</i>
liberalize	Make liberal or more liberal, of laws and rules. <i>The laws liberalized after Prohibition.</i>
mechanization	The introduction of machines or automatic devices into a process, activity, or place. <i>Both characters are portrayed by Dickens as complicit in the mechanization of human beings.</i>
modernity	The quality of being current or of the present. <i>An aura of technological modernity.</i>
modernization	The process of adapting something to modern needs or habits. <i>The industry is undergoing modernization.</i>
modernize	Make repairs, renovations, revisions or adjustments to. <i>He modernized the health service.</i>
poverty	The state of having little or no money and few or no material possessions. <i>The poverty of her imagination.</i>
productivity	The rate of production of new biomass by an individual, population, or community; the fertility or capacity of a given habitat or area. <i>The long term productivity of land.</i>

<u>progression</u>	A movement forward. <i>The vista unfolds in a progression of castles and vineyards as seemingly endless as the Rhine itself.</i>
redecorate	Apply paint or wallpaper in (a room or building) again, typically differently. <i>You will have to redecorate the room afterwards.</i>
renovate	Refresh; reinvigorate. <i>My wife wants us to renovate.</i>
rise	Rise up. <i>The car couldn't make it up the rise.</i>
sophisticate	Make someone or something more sophisticated. <i>He is still the butt of jokes made by New York sophisticates.</i>
<u>surge</u>	Rise and move, as in waves or billows. <i>The journalists surged forward.</i>
<u>upgrade</u>	Raise (something) to a higher standard, in particular improve (equipment or machinery) by adding or replacing components. <i>I've upgraded my computer so I can run better software.</i>
<u>urbanization</u>	The condition of being urbanized. <i>Public opposition to the urbanization of the countryside.</i>
westernization	Assimilation of Western culture; the social process of becoming familiar with or converting to the customs and practices of Western civilization.
